

Magnox Socio-economic Funding in the Community

2019/20 Socio-economic scheme update

To date this financial year ten organisations have been awarded funding through the Socio-economic scheme with a total of £186,916 in the surrounding communities of Trawsfynydd site.

Groups that have benefited from the funding are:

Ysgol Eifion Wyn, Porthmadog, Ysgol Treferthyr, Criccieth and Ysgol Talsarnau have all benefited with funding for outdoor education equipment from the good neighbour level funding of up to £1,000.

Clocswyr Tegid was awarded £1,000 to help buy 25 pairs of handmade wooden children's clogs to keep the traditional welsh culture alive by offering free workshops for schools within the URDD programme in 2020.

Eisteddfod Llawrplwy a Phenstryd received £600 to support the annual Trawsfynydd event for another three years.

North Wales Mamal Group purchased a bat lure for its Nathasius Pipistrelle survey project with the help of a £1,000 contribution from Magnox. This enabled the group to work collaboratively with Gwynedd Bat Group to confirm the rare species' presence at three new locations including Trawsfynydd Lake.

Bro Ffestiniog also received £2,016 to help purchase podcast and filming equipment. 30 individuals are to receive broadcast skills training through Bangor University. They will then be equipped to commission short films, interviews and promote community events via BROcast with the equipment funded by Magnox.

Llanbedr Community Council was awarded £2,000 to commission and erect two attractive bilingual interpretation boards in the village and woodland area of Llanbedr. These boards, displaying the Magnox logo, will encourage visitors and locals to explore these areas, not only for exercise, but also to improve the understanding of local nature history.



Some of the larger, transformational applications supported:

The Outdoor Partnership – Magnox have committed £180,000 towards the £1.5m five year continuation of the Pathways to Employment Programme which began in 2012. Working with local people with mental health problems and individuals with disabilities the Outdoor Partnership are continuing to remove barriers for underrepresented groups in the outdoor sector. In this first year, they aspire to recruit 250 new volunteer leaders, support local inclusive clubs and continue encouraging individuals to gain National Governing Body qualifications. They aim to improve access to outdoor activity taster experiences for 4,000 individuals with disabilities and engage and support 300 people with mental health problems, working in partnership with Mental Health Units in the area.



Last July, The Outdoor Partnership gave a presentation at the NDA summit, held on Anglesey. They later announced they have been awarded a £2.9m Lottery Community Fund grant to recreate the success of their Snowdonia based projects in five regions, beginning with three similar mountain areas in East Ayrshire (Scotland), Newry (Northern Ireland) and Cumbria.

STEM Gogledd Project – Magnox have supported the project with a contribution of £201,000 over four years towards the £2m project.

The official launch of the STEM Gogledd project took place in MSParc Science Park last October with Dyfed Jones, the Project's Regional Manager, opening the event. Gwen Parry-Jones, CEO Magnox, was a guest speaker, along with Kirsty Williams AM, Minister for Education. Huw Smith, the newly appointed Improvement Officer for the project, also presented.

The project offers a range of interventions that complement, but not duplicate, mainstream services. The aim is to increase the up take in STEM (Science Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects amongst 11-19 year olds, especially females.

Nearing the end of the second year, STEM Gogledd has formed a regional management team, developed a bespoke STEM Hub for students to access and appointed STEM Mentors to work with schools in Anglesey, Conwy and Gwynedd.

Arloesi Gwynedd Wledig was awarded £285,000 from Magnox to continue the £5m pilot scheme and initiatives programme to 2023.

Menter Môn delivers the project on behalf of the Local Action Group, under the title Arloesi Gwynedd Wledig. This aligns to the LEADER's themes and focus areas of the Wales Rural Development Programme.



In this second phase, the rural community enterprise initiative is set to deliver £8M in economic benefit, create 10 new business and 30 new jobs over the next three years.

Activities are run on a trial basis whereby successful projects can be replicated in other areas of the county.

The project received £285,000 directly from the NDA in 2016 for phase one. Dafydd Gruffydd, Menter Môn MD, presented a well-received overview of their achievements at the 2018 NDA summit in Gloucester.

This included the fitbit for cows; Wifi in Aberdaron; crowd funding for hydro electrical installations at Dyffryn Ogwen and Dyffryn Peris; the drone academy in Llanbedr and the 'Time to Venture' project, which supported four individuals to pursue entrepreneurship.

The Magnox scheme provides funding to support activities that benefit the social or economic life of communities, in support of the NDA's responsibilities under the Energy Act (2004) to mitigate the socio-economic impact of its work programme where it operates. The scheme has three funding aims:

1. Being a good neighbour
2. Helping to build sustainable communities
3. Supporting transformational projects that mitigate the impact of decommissioning Magnox sites.

Funding is available on a rolling programme and prioritised towards building sustainable communities and mitigating the impact of decommissioning Magnox sites, where the biggest and most sustainable socio-economic benefit can be achieved.

Offer denu ystlumod ger Llyn Traws

Grŵp Mamaliaid Gogledd Cymru - wedi prynu offer denu ystlumod ar gyfer eu prosiect *Nathasius Pipistrelle* gyda chymorth cyfraniad o £1,000 gan Magnox. Yr oedd hyn yn galluogi'r grŵp i weithio ar y cyd â Grŵp Ystlumod Gwynedd i gadarnhau presenoldeb y rhywogaeth brin mewn tri lleoliad newydd gan gynnwys Llyn Trawsfynydd.

Cwmni Cymunedol Bro Ffestiniog - sydd hefyd wedi derbyn £2,016 tuag at brynu offer ffilmio a phodlediadau. Mae 30 o unigolion am dderbyn hyfforddiant ar sgiliau darlledu drwy Brifysgol Bangor. Yna byddant yn barod ar gyfer comisiynu ffilmiau byr, cyfweiliadau a hyrwyddo digwyddiadau cymunedol drwy gyfrwng 'BROcast' gyda'r offer a ariannwyd gan Magnox.

Cyngor Cymuned Llanbedr - wedi derbyn £2,000 i gomisiynu a chodi dau o fyrddau dehongli deniadol a dwyieithog yn y pentref ac yn ardal goediog Llanbedr. Bydd y byrddau hyn, sy'n arddangos logo Magnox, yn annog ymwelwyr a phobl leol i archwilio'r ardaloedd hyn, nid yn unig er mwyn ymarfer corff, ond hefyd i wella'u dealltwriaeth o hanes natur lleol.



Dyma rai o'r ceisiadau trawsnewid mwy a gafodd eu cefnogi:

Y Bartneriaeth Awyr Agored - mae Magnox wedi ymrwymo £180,000 tuag at barhad pum mlynedd y Rhaglen £1.5m Llwybrau i Waith a ddechreuodd yn 2012. Gan weithio gyda phobl leol â phroblemau iechyd meddwl ac unigolion ag anableddau, mae'r Bartneriaeth Awyr Agored yn parhau i gael gwared â rhwystrau ar gyfer grwpiau sy'n cael eu tangynrychioli yn y sector awyr agored. Yn y flwyddyn gyntaf, maen nhw'n gobeithio recriwtio 250 o arweinwyr gwirfoddolwyr newydd, cynorthwyo grwpiau cynhwysol lleol a pharhau i annog unigolion i ennill cymwysterau'r Corff Llywodraethu Cenedlaethol. Eu nod yw gwella mynediad at brofiadau blasu gweithgareddau awyr agored ar gyfer 4,000 o unigolion gydag anableddau ac ymgysylltu â 300 o bobl gyda phroblemau iechyd meddwl a'u cynorthwyo, gan weithio mewn partneriaeth ag Unedau Iechyd Meddwl yn yr ardal.



Fis Gorffennaf diwethaf, rhoddodd y Bartneriaeth Awyr Agored gyflwyniad yn uwchgynhadledd yr NDA a gynhaliwyd ar Ynys Môn. Yn ddiweddarach, fe wnaethant gyhoeddi eu bod wedi derbyn grant o £2.9m o Gronfa Gymunedol y Loteri i ail-greu llwyddiant eu prosiectau yn Eryri mewn pum rhanbarth arall, gan ddechrau gydag

ardaloedd mynyddig tebyg yn Nwyrain Swydd Ayr (yr Alban), Newry (Gogledd Iwerddon) ac yn Cumbria.

Prosiect STEM y Gogledd – Mae Magnox wedi cefnogi'r prosiect gyda chyfraniad o £201,000 dros bedair blynedd tuag at y prosiect £2m.

Cynhaliwyd lansiad swyddogol STEM y Gogledd ym Mharc Gwyddoniaeth MSParc fis Hydref diwethaf, gyda Dyfed Jones, Rheolwr Rhanbarthol y Prosiect, yn agor y digwyddiad.

Roedd Gwen Parry-Jones, Prif Swyddog Gweithredol Magnox, yn siaradwr gwadd, ynghyd â Kirsty Williams AC, y Gweinidog Addysg. Rhoddwyd cyflwyniad hefyd gan Huw Smith, y Swyddog Gwelliant a benodwyd i'r prosiect.

Mae'r prosiect yn cynnig ystod o ymyriadau sy'n ategu, ond ddim yn dyblygu, gwasanaethau prif ffrwd. Y nod yw cynyddu'r nifer sy'n ymgymryd â phynciau STEM

(Gwyddoniaeth, Technoleg, Peirianeg a Mathemateg) ymysg pobl ifanc 11-19 mlwydd oed, yn enwedig merched.

Yn dynesu at ddiwedd yr ail flwyddyn, mae STEM y Gogledd wedi ffurfio tîm rheoli rhanbarthol, wedi datblygu Hwb STEM penodol i fyfyrwyr gael mynediad ato ac wedi penodi Mentoriaid STEM i weithio gydag ysgolion ar Ynys Môn, yng Nghonwy ac yng Ngwynedd.

Arloesi Gwynedd Wledig - dyfarnwyd £285,000 gan Magnox er mwyn i'r cynllun peilot £5m a'r rhaglen fentrau barhau hyd 2023.

Menter Môn sy'n cyflawni'r prosiect ar ran y Grŵp Gweithredu Lleol, dan y teitl Arloesi Gwynedd Wledig. Mae'n alinio â themâu'r a meysydd ffocws LEADER yn Rhaglen Datblygu Gwledig Cymru.



Yn yr ail gam hwn, mae'r cynllun menter gymunedol wledig ar y ffordd i gyflawni £8M o fudd economaidd, 10 busnes newydd a 30 o swyddi newydd dros y tair blynedd nesaf.

Caiff gweithgareddau eu cynnal ar sail treialu, fel y gall prosiectau llwyddiannus gael eu copïo mewn ardaloedd eraill o'r sir.

Derbyniodd y prosiect £285,000 yn uniongyrchol gan yr NDA yn 2016 ar gyfer cam un. Cyflwynodd Dafydd Gruffydd, Rheolwr Gyfarwyddwr Menter Môn, drosolwg o'u llwyddiannau yn uwchgynhadledd yr NDA yng Nghaerloyw yn 2018, a chafodd dderbyniad da.

Roedd yn cynnwys y 'fitbit' i wartheg; Wifi yn Aberdaron; cyllido torfol ar gyfer gosodiadau trydan dŵr yn Nyffryn Ogwen a Dyffryn Peris; yr academi dronau yn Llanbedr a'r prosiect 'Amser Mento' a roddodd gefnogaeth i bedwar o unigolion ddilyn llwybr entrepreneuriaeth.

Mae cynllun Magnox yn darparu cyllid i gefnogi gweithgareddau sydd o fudd i fywyd cymdeithasol neu economaidd cymunedau, er mwyn cefnogi cyfrifoldebau'r NDA dan y Ddeddf Ynni (2004) i leihau effaith economaidd-gymdeithasol ei raglen waith yn yr ardaloedd lle mae'n gweithio. Mae gan y cynllun dri nod o ran cyllido:

1. Bod yn gymydog da
2. Helpu i greu cymunedau cynaliadwy
3. Cefnogi prosiectau trawsnewid sy'n lleihau effaith datgomisiynu safleoedd Magnox.

Mae cyllid ar gael ar raglen dreigl a rhoddir blaenoriaeth i adeiladu cymunedau cynaliadwy a lliniaru effaith datgomisiynu safleoedd Magnox, lle y gellir cyflawni'r budd economaidd-gymdeithasol mwyaf a'r mwyaf cynaliadwy.
