Safety and environment

- Regular campaigns focus on safety topics:
 - New campaign on Psychological Safety
 - You are not a Tool – Hand Injuries
 - Current Target Zero theme is Lifting Operations
- Since the previous LCLC, there have been no Significant Environmental and Safety related events, with a continued positive reporting culture supported by task observations



Annual inspection

- Fifth annual Bradwell care and maintenance inspection commenced 4th September 2023.
- We will undertake approximately 200 routine maintenance, inspections & examinations this autumn To include civil inspections, electrical and mechanical inspections and testing.
- Having analysed the data from previous annual campaigns, we have reduced the frequency of some of the inspection activities – Mainly Asbestos Re-inspections

Site updates

- Due to unforeseen circumstances, the date for completing the receipt of regional ILW packages has moved out.
- Magnox submitted Section 73 applications to Essex County Council in July to vary planning conditions.



Bradwell ISF

- The applications request that the importation date is extended by 6 years until 31st December 2029.
- There is no change in total package numbers (170) at this stage but this remains under review as decommissioning work progress and estimates are refined.

Soc-ec 2023-24:

- **Magnox soc-ec funding** remains at £1,020,035 annually available across all 12 Magnox sites, with £302,958 multi year funding already committed.
- £690,982 has been committed as of 6 September 2023.
- £285,167 remaining (including £72,000 Good Neighbour allocation with £43,326 left).
- 4 Bradwell funding requests totalling £92,577
- **Good neighbour funding £2,000** per application; however £6,000 allocation per site remains unchanged. If you are applying for funding, you must be a constituted organisation and provide quotes for the items you are requesting.

Bradwell applications 2023-24:

- **Bradwell Bay Utd. FC** £1,300 Towards football kit
Note: (£4,700 remaining of £6,000 Good Neighbour allocation for Bradwell).
- **Fellowship Afloat Charitable Trust** £3,000 – towards purchase of safety equipment for High-Ropes access activities
- **Maldon District Council** £80,000 over 2 years (£40,000 per annum) for role to manage and administer the Rural Enterprise Prosperity Fund (£480,328) successfully applied for by MDC.
- **Maldon District Council** £7,708 Year 2 funding for U Fest Festival support for annual well-being event for the whole district.

NDA Socio-economic Strategy Refresh 2023-24

- Under the Energy Act (2004), the NDA has a socio-economic role which recognises the importance of delivering the decommissioning programme in a socially responsible way. The approach to this is explained in the NDA Local Social and Economic Impact Strategy which was last published in July 2020.
- Since then, much has happened to shape the economic challenges, opportunities, and priorities in the communities around the NDA estate. The NDA is commencing a refresh of the Local Social and Economic Impact Strategy.
- Over the coming months the NDA wish to engage with stakeholders across the UK including LCLC's and SSG's to better understand the social and economic priorities in our communities to identify priority areas of focus, to align our internal processes and systems, and to make best use of the funding available across the group for maximum community benefit. Once developed, the new strategy will be subject to a period of public consultation before it is finalised and published.

Neighbourly offers giving programmes throughout the year, so small charities and community organisations can receive help and support free of charge!

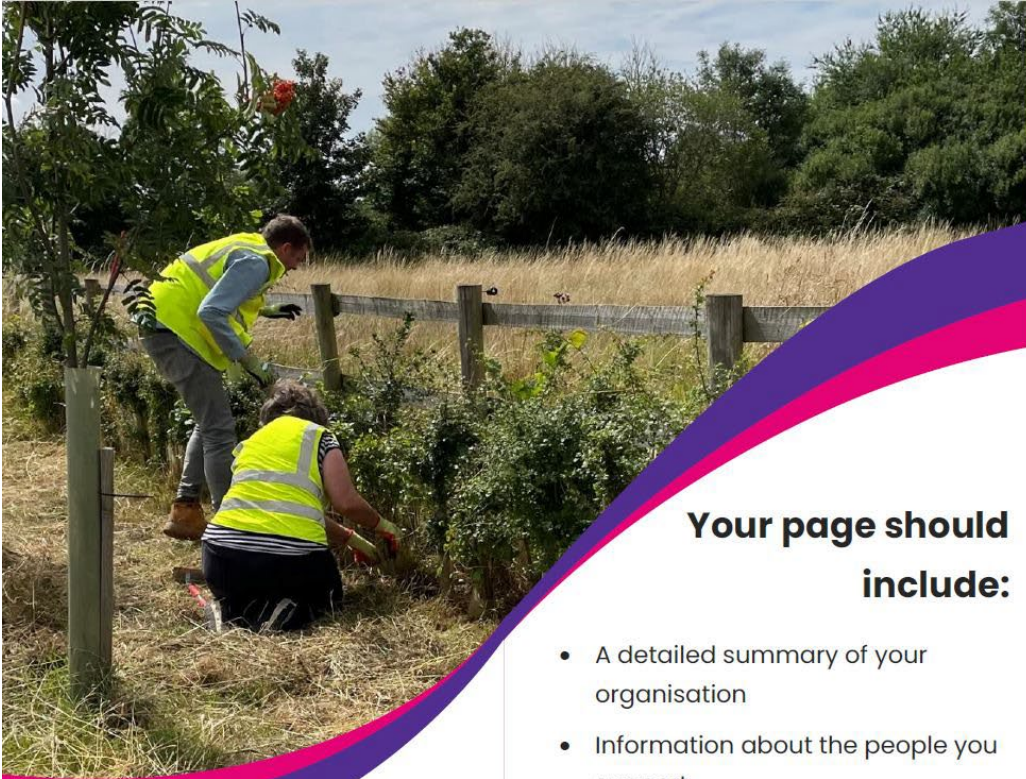


Why Volunteer?
