Waste update

- The site exceeded the 'good' target for intermediate-level waste retrievals last year and is continuing with retrievals this year.
- Both vault 1 and vault 3 wastes are being retrieved by Site teams using remote handling plan, some of which is still in commissioning.
- The low-level waste shipment target was met last year with a further 6 shipments planned for 2024/25.



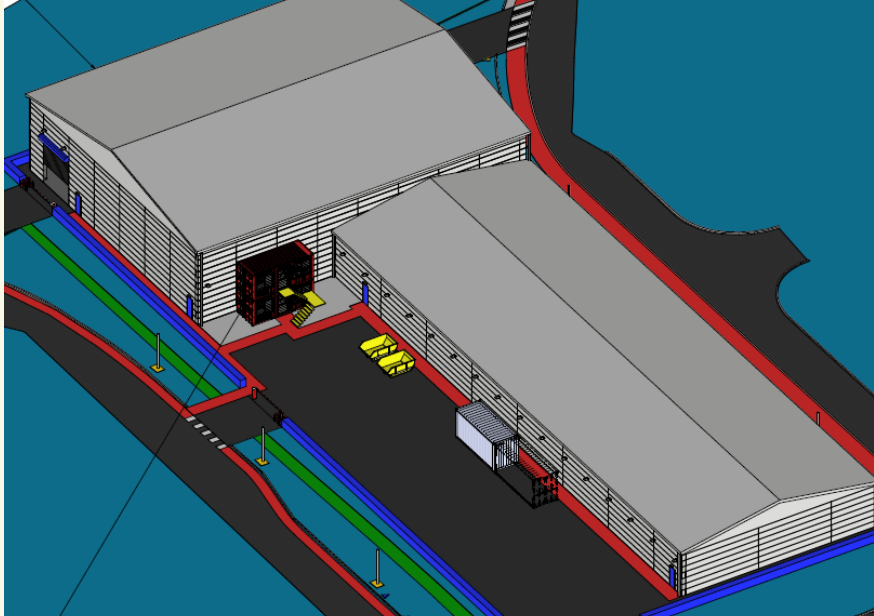


Site activities

Contract 1 - Blower House
emptying, remediation and demolition.

Altrad have commenced Site work, establishing welfare and accommodation facilities on Site. Work on preparing the blower houses for waste processing has started.

Contract 2 - Metallic waste management.

Contractors (NSG/Augean) have commenced construction of the waste facility, due to be complete early 2025.

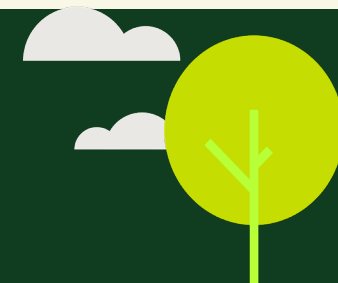
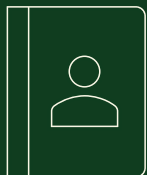
