Waste update

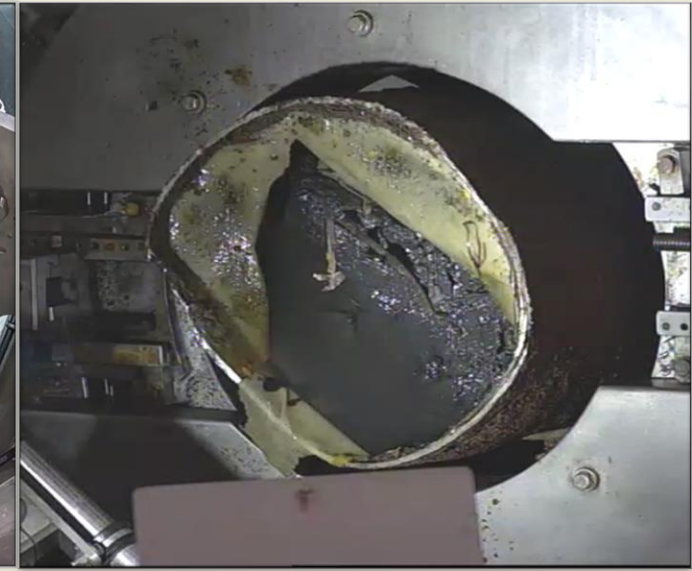
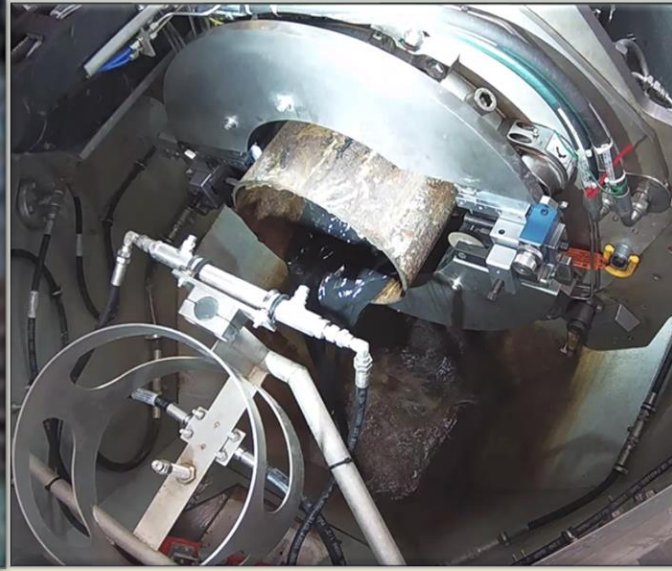
- 6 more concrete boxes filled since the last meeting. ILW retrievals are 29 tonnes against a target of 37 tonnes for the financial year.
- Retrievals in the Shielded Area are progressing with the second MOSAIK DCIC filled and the third imported ready for filling.
- Four low level waste shipments have also been completed so far this financial year, with three more planned.

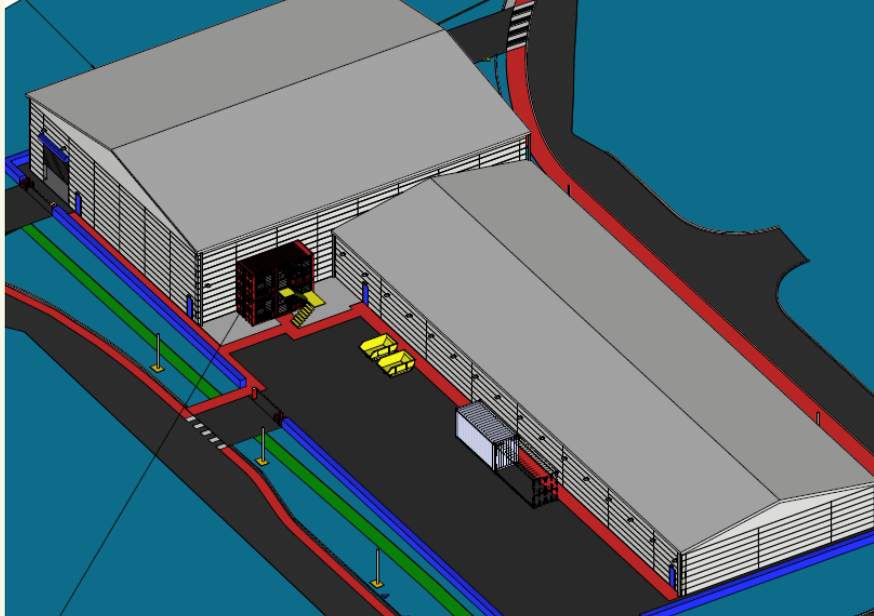


Excellent progress in MILWEP

Contract 1 - Blower House emptying, remediation and demolition.

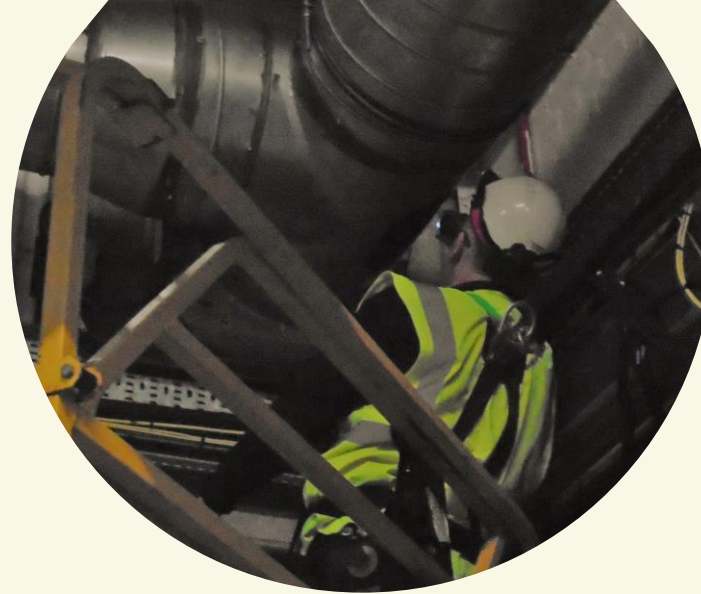
Altrad have a small team at site and are progressing with documentation and arranging various site visits for their sub-contractors to finalise designs for waste retrieval from the blower houses due to start late 2024.

Contract 2 - Metallic waste management.

Contractors (NSG/Augean) have mobilised to commence construction of the waste facility, due to be complete early 2025.

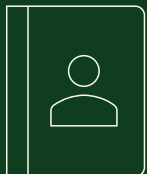

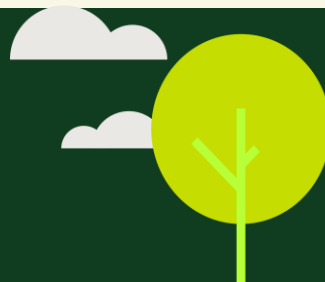

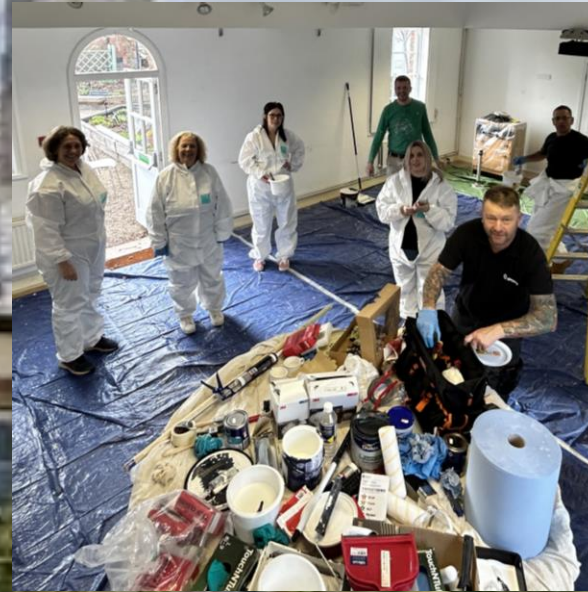
