Operational Experience Feedback

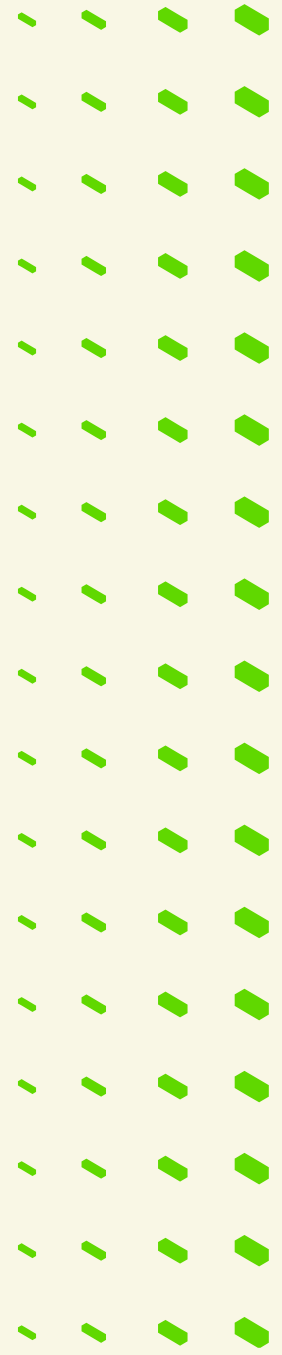
- A consistent positive reporting culture at Bradwell enabling learning and highlighting areas for improvement.
- No first aid incidents or accidents.
- Cess pit unexpected high level in December due to water ingress.

- The EA are performing an inspection of the arrangements put in place at the time of entry into Care and Maintenance

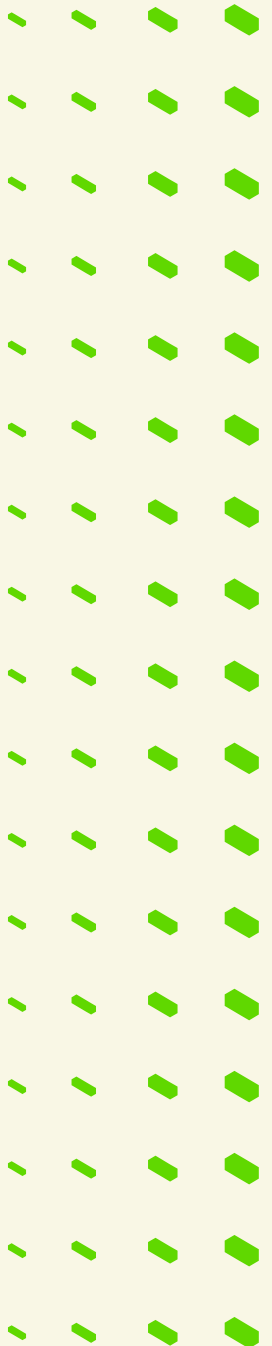
Mental Health Awareness

- The company and site recognise the challenges posed by Mental Health issues. An NRS Mental Health First Aider is attending Bradwell Site in March to share his own experience of Mental Health issues and former addiction, to raise awareness and reduce the stigma surrounding mental health issues.



Site Update - Annual Inspection

- The annual Bradwell Care and Maintenance inspection campaign is to commence in September 2024 for a duration of approx. three months
 - We will undertake approximately 250 routine maintenance, inspections & examinations including civil, electrical and mechanical disciplines
 - We will be enacting the first step in a revised long-term approach to the maintenance and inspection to specific assets such as voids
- Through analysis of data from previous annual campaigns, we continue to review and optimise, where appropriate, the frequency of some of the inspection activities, e.g. Asbestos.

ILW Update

During FY 23/24 twenty-one Mosaiks (four consignments) received into ISF to date.

Ongoing programme of Dungeness A ILW retrievals continues until FY 27/28



LLW Update

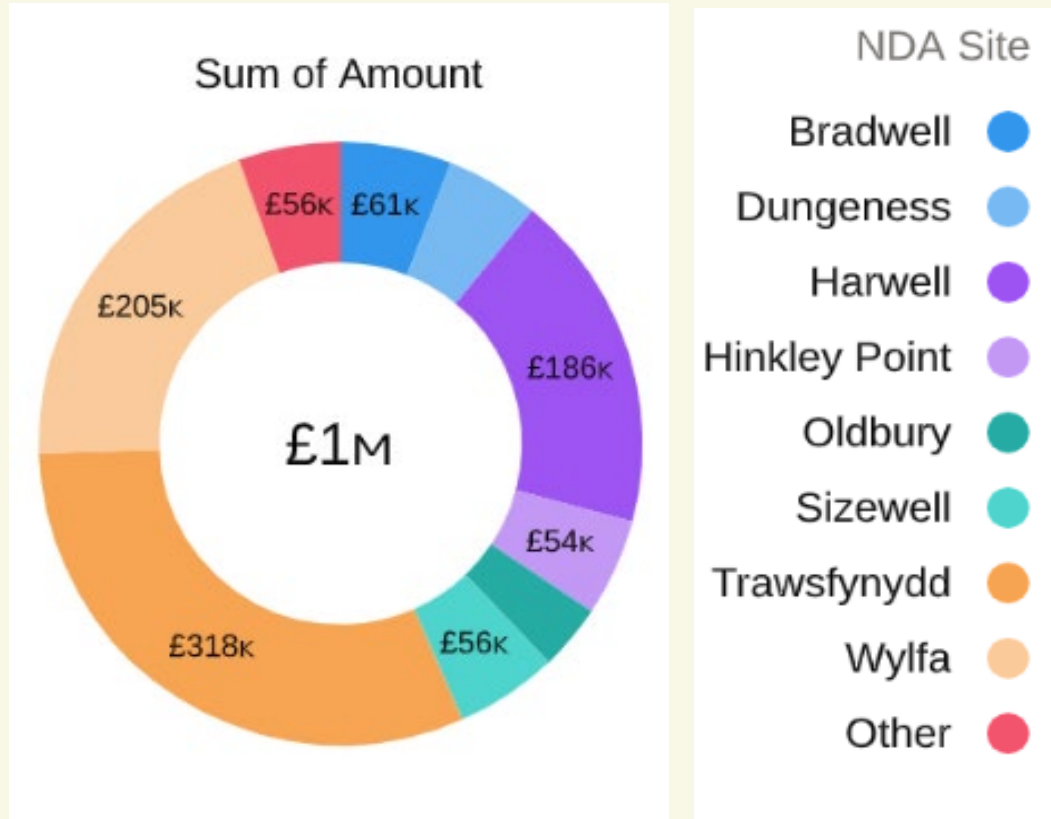
No LLW processing facilities remain at Bradwell following entry into C&M.

Planning permission granted early FY 23/24 to enable transfer of legacy LLW to Sizewell A for onward processing and disposal.

136 drums of legacy soft waste transferred to Sizewell A in June 2023. Waste generated during annual inspections and ISF works since C&M entry.

Future waste arisings are expected to be minimal but will be transferred to Sizewell A under Planning consent to maintain Bradwell LLW inventory at zero.

Nuclear Restoration Services (NRS) socio-economic scheme spend 2023-24



- NRS Soc-ec Funding remains at £1,020,035 annually available.
- This year £15k reversed accrual = £1,035,035
- £1,033,707 committed to date
- £1.328 remaining

Socio Economic 2023-24

- Nuclear Restoration Services Socio Economic funding remains at £1,020,035 with £302,958 multiyear funding already committed
- Good Neighbour funding £2,000 per application; however, £6,000 allocation per site remains unchanged. Remember, if you are applying for funding, you must be a constituted organisation and provide quotes for the items you are requesting. (scheme funding guidance 2022).

Bradwell 11 successful applications 2023-24: £105,938

- **Bradwell Bay Utd. FC £1,300** Towards football kit
- **Abberton Rural Training (ART) £5,000** - Maldon Horticulture, Education & Community Garden Project
- **Fellowship Afloat Charitable Trust £3,000** – towards purchase of safety equipment for High-Ropes access activities
- **Maldon & District Voluntary Service (MDCVS) £1,430** – towards Southminster “Railway Shed”
- **Maldon District Council £7,708** – towards UFest 2024
- **The Royal Victoria Rowing Club £1,000** – Purchase a pair of oars
- **West Mersea Cricket Club £1,500** – towards new mobile covers
- **Maldon District Council £80,000** over 2 years (£40,000 per annum) for role to manage and administer the Rural Enterprise Prosperity Fund (£480,328).
- **MDCVS £35,000** – to enable organisation to rationalise and plan for future years.
- **Maldon District Community Supermarket £10,000** – towards the purchase and operation of a mobile supermarket to reach rural areas during cost-of- living crisis.

NDA Socio-economic Strategy Refresh 2023-24

- Following the 12-week consultation with local authorities and the communities around our NRS sites, the consultation closed 21/02/24.
- The comments and feedback are now being considered and incorporated into the new strategy where possible.
- A new NDA Social Impact and Communities Strategy document is to be published end of March/beginning of April 2024.
