Gwobrau Gwasanaeth Hir

Yn Wylfa, rhoddwyd tair gwobr 20 mlynedd ym mis Rhagfyr 2023 gydag un 40 mlynedd, un 30 mlynedd a thair gwobr 20 mlynedd i'w rhoi eleni.

Y Diweddarafr am y Safle

Rhaglen ddatgomisiynu

- Mae angen System Troshaen Trydanol newydd ac annibynnol a fydd yn bodloni safonau modern, yn ogystal â bod yn fwy priodol ar gyfer safle gofal a chynnal a chadw. Dywedodd SL fod y dyluniad manwl wedi dechrau a bod paratodau ar y gweill i glirio hambyrddau ceblau a'r switsfyrddau diangen. Mae Cynllun Daearu newydd wedi'i gwblhau ac yn aros i adroddiad gael ei gyhoeddi.
- Mae prosiectau Gwaredu Asbestos Adweithyddion yn cefnogi strategaeth y cwmni ar gyfer lleihau'r perygl asbestos cyn mynd i'r cam gofal a chynnal a chadw. Mae drafft strategaeth y prosiect wedi cael ei gyhoeddi ac yn aros am ei lofnodi. Dywedodd SL fod cyflawni Porth 1 yn mynd rhagddo'n gynt na'r disgwyl.

- Gwaredu Sgipiau DSC4 – mae cam presennol y prosiect hwn yn cynnwys ysgrifennu nifer o fanylebau i ddiffinio manylion gwahanol agweddau sy'n gysylltiedig â chael mynediad at y gell, adfer gwaith dur a dodrefn y gell cyn cwblhau'r gwaith dihalogi. Hyd yma, drafftiwyd y canlynol:-
 - Manyleb ar gyfer y concriid fydd yn torri i mewn i'r gell
 - Manyleb y weithfan ar y cap peil
 - Manyleb yr hoist ar gyfer codi sgipiau allan o'r gell.
- Gwastraff HAW/LAW – Dywedodd SL fod y ddau brosiect uchod wedi'u hoedi ar hyn o bryd gan nad oes raid symud ymlaen am y tro, ac y gelir dal cyrraedd y targed cwblhau yn 2027.
- Cyfleuster Storio DCIC – nod y prosiect yw adeiladu a chomisiynu ISF ar gyfer storio dim mwy na 24 DCIC wedi'u llwytho â Gwastraff Lefel Ganolraddol (ILW) am gyfnod o 120 o flynyddoedd. Yn aros ar hyn o bryd am EAN wedi'i ddilysu a'i gyhoeddi.
- Mae Cynllun Rheoli Amgylchedd Safle Wylfa NRS newydd wedi cael ei gyhoeddi sy'n rhoi'r wybodaeth ddiweddarafr am yr hyn sydd wedi cael ei ddatblygu/gymeradwyo hyd yma.

Meysydd i'w Gwella

- Canlyniadau Legionella Uchel – mae trefn fflysio well ar waith ac yn cael ei hadolygu'n gyson. Nododd SL nad oes unrhyw broblemau iechyd ar y safle ar hyn o bryd.
- Nid oedd gwastraff a neilltuwyd oddi ar y safle heb gyrraedd y safle gwaredu arfaethedig – trafodwyd y mater gan Reolwyr y Safle, Mitie Management, a'r cludwyr gwastraff Flakt Group, a'i ddatrys drwy ei ddanfôn i'r safle gwaredu.
- Uned Aerdymheru F-nwy yn gollwng- canfuwyd ei fod yn ddiffygiol. Gofynnwyd i Flakt roi dyfynbris ar gyfer atgyweirio, fodd bynnag, nodwyd hefyd bod yr uned bellach yn wag fel na all mwy o nwy oeri ollwng.

Cynaliadwyedd

Dywedodd SL fod Grŵp Cynaliadwyedd y safle wedi parhau i gyfarfod bob chwarter. Mae'r materion a drafodwyd wedi cynnwys cyflwyno llwybr gwastraff newydd ar gyfer dillad gwaith wedi'u brandio; rhoi'r gorau i ddefnyddio llestri deunydd llysieuol ar gyfer prydau bwyd; treialu defnyddio wrinalau di-ddŵr; cynnal cynllun beicio i'r gwaith ar y cyd â Halfords. Mae hefyd wedi cynnal ymgyrch plannu coed lle cafodd dros 300 o goed eu cynnig i gydweithwyr ar y safle a'r ysgol leol.

STEM

Dywedodd SL fod ymweliadau ysgolion â'r Safle wedi parhau a diolchodd i lysgenhadon STEM sy'n rhoi o'u hamser i ysbrydoli'r genhedlaeth nesaf o arloeswyr. Bydd cyfleoedd profiad gwaith yn ailddechrau ym mis Gorffennaf eleni.

Materion economaidd-gymdeithasol NRS

Dywedodd SL fod y dyraniad NRS llawn o £1.02m wedi cael ei ddefnyddio ym mlwyddyn ariannol 2023-24 gyda £204,480 o'r prosiectau ategol hyn yn agos at safle Wylfa. Mae prosiect Ynni'r Llanw Morlais wedi cael £900K hyd yma, gydag ymrwymiad ar gyfer £900k arall gan NRS/NDA ar y cyd dros y tair blynedd nesaf. Derbyniodd Cynllun Adfywio Cyngor Sir Ynys Môn £75,000 arall i gomisiynu arolygon o'r economi ymwelwyr a chynlluniau i wella amwynderau twristiaeth lleol. Roedd £9680 o gyllid NRS yn caniatáu i Ysbrydoli gan Sbarduno gynnig sesiynau adolygu mathemateg TGAU am ddim i fyfyrwyr ar Ynys Môn. O ran grantiau llai, dyfarnwyd £5000 i Gyngor Cymuned Llanelian tuag at brosiect gwerth £42,000 i adfywio ardal chwarae Lôn Tyddyn Waen sydd hefyd yn cael ei ddefnyddio gan yr Ysgol Gynradd leol.

Adnewyddiad economaidd-gymdeithasol yr NDA

Dywedodd SL fod y ddogfen uchod, yn dilyn cyfnod ymgynghori cyhoeddus o 12 wythnos, wedi cael ei chyhoeddi ar 5 Ebrill 2024 a'i bod bellach ar gael ar-lein.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i SL am ei adroddiad a llongyfarchodd ef a'r holl staff ar eu record diogelwch ardderchog; eu hymgyssylltiad â phobl ifanc ledled Gogledd Orllewin Cymru; a'r

manteision parhaus i'r ardal drwy'r grantiau cymorth economaidd-gymdeithasol. Yna gwahoddodd yr aelodau i gyflwyno unrhyw gwestiynau.

Sesiwn Holi ac Ateb

Holodd VC sut y gallai aelodau'r Grŵp ddarparu cymorth. Nododd SL mai ychydig iawn o gyfleoedd rhyngweithiol uniongyrchol sydd, fodd bynnag, byddai'n ddefnyddiol ac yn gadarnhaol i aelodau'r Grŵp Rhanddeiliaid Safle hyrwyddo NRS fel cyflogwr da ar gyfer y dyfodol.

Holodd JL o ble y daeth y staff asiantaeth a beth yw eu cylch gwaith. Dywedodd SL nad oedd y broses bontio yn cadw digon o drydanwyr, a bod y staff asiantaeth yn lleol. Mae proses recriwtio ar y gweill, fodd bynnag, bydd angen arbenigedd achlysurol bob amser.

Diolchodd LLMH i SL am rannu'r holl wybodaeth a gofynnodd iddo fynegi diolchgarwch aelodau'r Grŵp Rhanddeiliaid Safle am holl waith caled holl staff y safle.

Dymunai GOJ longyfarch y staff ar yr holl agweddau diogelwch a adlewyrchir yn yr adroddiad. Roedd hefyd yn falch o nodi cyflogaeth barhaus pobl ifanc a gofynnodd pa brofiadau maen nhw'n eu cael y gallan nhw fanteisio arnynt nhw yn y dyfodol. Nododd SL fod llai o gyfleoedd yn ddi-os nag mewn blynyddoedd blaenorol. Mae'r aelodau iau o staff yn dysgu sgiliau sylfaenol da a gyflwynir gan Arweinwyr Tîm sy'n cael eu hannog i fentora.

Nododd GWR bwysigrwydd cyfleu'r math hwn o wybodaeth y tu allan i'r fforwm hwn a holodd a oedd system swyddi gwag ar waith ar gyfer staff. Cadarnhaodd SL mai ychydig iawn o swyddi gwag sy'n cael eu hysbysebu'n allanol mewn ffordd sy'n hygyrch i bawb. Fodd bynnag, ychydig iawn o swyddi gwag sydd ar gael ar hyn o bryd.

Gofynnodd GWR a oedd hi'n bosibl cael nosweithiau agored ar y safle i rieni. Dywedodd SL fod ymdrechion ar y cyd yn cael eu gwneud gan staff i ymgysylltu'n uniongyrchol â'r ysgolion. Cyfeiriodd VC at fanteision bwrdd swyddi proffil uchel arfaethedig Ynys Rydd.

- Gwaith parhaus gyda'r gweithlu i ddatblygu strategaeth 10 mlynedd fel yr oedd SL wedi'i ddisgrifio'n flaenorol.
- Mae cwmni seisio barn wedi ymgymryd â gwaith i ymgysylltu â phobl ifanc ar draws rhanbarth gogledd orllewin Lloegr. Nid yw'r gwaith hwn wedi'i gwblhau eto ond rhagwelir y bydd fideo'n cael ei gyflwyno i'r aelodau yng nghyfarfod nesaf y Grŵp ym mis Hydref.
- Bydd rhagor o ddigwyddiadau ymgysylltu o amgylch yr ardal, ond gan nad oes gan Wylfa Ganolfan Ymwelwyr mwyach, bydd NRS yn archwilio lleoliadau a dulliau eraill ar gyfer ymgysylltu'n llawn.

7. Yr Awdurdod Datgomisiynu Niwclear

Croesawyd David Wallace i'r cyfarfod fel cynrychiolydd newydd yr NDA ar gyfer Cymru a'r Alban. Cyfeiriodd at y canlynol:-

- Yn yr Alban, mae'r NDA wrthi'n adolygu ymgysylltiad Seneddol a'r hyn y gellir ei ddysgu oddi wrth ei gilydd er mwyn sicrhau dull gweithredu cyson. I'r perwyl hwn, sefydlwyd grŵp trawsbleidiol ac mae wedi cyfarfod am y tro cyntaf yr wythnos diwethaf i edrych ar ddatgomiynu a 'glanhau' amgylcheddol, nododd DW fod y berthynas â chynrychiolwyr etholedig yn ymddangos yn well yng Nghymru.
- Roedd nifer dda yn bresennol mewn digwyddiad Rhanddeiliaid Rhanbarthol ym Mhrifysgol Bangor ac roedd yn fuddiol er mwyn tynnu sylw at arbenigedd niwclear yng Nghymru, ac i sicrhau ymgysylltiad â phobl ifanc.
- Cadarnhaodd digwyddiad Cadeiryddion Grwpiau Rhanddeiliaid Safle ym Manceinion bwysigrwydd Grwpiau Rhanddeiliaid Safle a bod angen rhoi mwy o gyhoeddusrwydd i'w rôl a'i gylch gwaith.
- Ar hyn o bryd edrychir ar leoliadau ar gyfer y digwyddiad wyneb yn wyneb nesaf – bydd yr aelodau'n cael y wybodaeth ddiweddaraf.
- Bydd angen cytuno ar Arolwg Rhanddeiliaid chwemisol.
- Strategaeth 5 yr NDA i'w chyhoeddi Mawrth 2026
- Ymgysylltu â Rhanddeiliaid y Cyfleuster Gwaredu Daearegol (GDF) yn parhau.
- Mae rhaglen graddedigion yr NDA wedi ailagor.
- Mae'r NDA a Rhwydwaith y Genhedlaeth Ifanc (YGN) y Sefydliad Niwclear wedi cyhoeddi eu bod yn ymestyn eu partneriaeth i 2025.

Dymunai David Wilby nodi nad oedd, yn anffodus, yn gallu mynychu digwyddiad diweddar yr NDA ym Mhrifysgol Bangor gan fod y gwahoddiad yn fyr rybudd. Nododd DW y sylw hwn er gwybodaeth yn y dyfodol.

Gofynnodd VC am ddiweddariad ar y safleoedd GDF arfaethedig. Cadarnhaodd DW fod tair cymuned yn parhau, ac er bod trafodaethau'n parhau, roedd yn benderfyniad terfynol i'r ardaloedd i bob pwrpas.

8 Diweddariad gan y Swyddfa Rheoleiddio Niwclear

Rhoddodd Ms Tanya MacLeod grynodedb o'r adroddiad a ddosbarthwyd yn flaenorol gyda phapurau'r cyfarfod. Roedd hi'n falch o nodi bod yr holl Arolygiadau a gynhaliwyd wedi cael eu graddio'n wyrdd – digonol, sef y lefel uchaf. Cyfeiriodd hefyd at symud i wythnos waith 4 diwrnod ac nad oedd adroddiad asesu prosiect yn cofnodi unrhyw newidiadau/problemiau sylweddol.

4. NDA Report – David Wallace the NDA representative for Wales and Scotland gave a verbal update on NDA issues.
5. Ms Tanya MacLeod gave a verbal summary on the report previously circulated with the meeting papers.
6. NRW/EA update report was also circulated with the meeting pack and David Wilby NRW provided a summary at the meeting.

1 Welcome and Receive Apologies for Absence

2. Approval of Minutes of the Meeting held 19.10.23.

The minutes, circulated prior to the meeting, were received and accepted as a true record. (DO/GW)

3 Matters Arising from the Previous Minutes

None raised

4 SSG Chairman's Report

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting and provided a brief update on the following:

- Face to face Manchester NRS SSG Chair/Vice Chair event on 22-23 November 2023
- SSG Forum Meeting via Teams 12 January 2024
- Face to face Manchester NDA SSG Chair Workshop – 20 March 2024

5 Wylfa Site Director's Report

SL presented a comprehensive report summarised as follows: -

An informative video was shared regarding the launch of NRS across all the UK sites. SL explained that NRS are responsible for the delivery of value for money decommissioning and restoration of nuclear sites ensuring that all our futures are safe, secure, and sustainable.

EHSS&Q statistics

SL reported on the safety statistics as follows:-

- Total recorded incident rate (TRIR): 0.00
- Days away case rate (DACR) 0.00
- Number of days since a lost time accident: 2094 days (as at 3 April 2024)

SL noted that whilst proud of the above figures there was no room for complacency.

People

Wylfa One Team

- 199 NRS site staff
- 82 MSO based at Wylfa.
- Site participated in and completed Psychological training.

Apprentices

SL noted that the apprentice intake for September has been completed and a contract offer for one electrical apprentice has been made. Currently seeking landing pads for those who complete their apprenticeships this August.

Long Service Awards

At Wylfa three 20-year awards were issued in December 2023 with one 40-year, one 30-year and three 20-year awards due this year.

Site Update

Decommissioning programme

- A new and independent Electrical Overlay System is required that will meet modern standards, as well as being more appropriate for a C & M site. SL stated that the detailed design had commenced and that preparations are underway to clear cable trays and the redundant switchboards. A new Earthing Design has been completed and awaiting report to be issued.
- Reactor Asbestos Removal projects supports the company strategy for reducing the asbestos hazard prior to entry to C&M stage. The project strategy draft has been issued and awaiting signatures. SL reported that achieving Gate 1 was ahead of schedule.
- Turbine Hall Islanding is a project to isolate the Turbine Hall and will include air gapping of services into and out of the Turbine Hall.

Waste programme

- DSC4 Skip Removal – current phase of this project involves writing a number of specifications to define the detail of various aspects involved in accessing the cell, retrieval of steelworks and cell furniture before completing the decontamination operation. To date the following have been drafted:-
 - Specification for concrete cutting into cell
 - Workstation specification on pile cap
 - Hoist specification for lifting skips out of cell.
- HAW/LAW waste - SL reported that both the above projects are currently paused as they can withstand progressing for now and still achieve the 2027 completion target.
- DCIC Storage Facility – the project aim is to construct and inactively commission an ISF for storage of no greater than 24 DCIC's loaded with ILW for a period of 120 years. Currently awaiting the verified and issued EAN.
- A new NRS Wylfa Site Environmental Management Plan has been issued which provides update on what has been developed/demolished to date.

Areas for Improvement

- High Legionella results – an enhanced flushing regime is in place and under constant review. SL noted that there are no immediate health issues on site.
- Waste consigned off site not arrived at intended disposal site – the issue was discussed by Site Management, Mitie Management, and the waste carrier Flakt group and resolved by delivery to the disposal site.

- Air Con Unit F-gas leak- until found to be defective. Flakt were asked to quote for repair, however, it was also noted that the unit is now empty so no more refrigerant gas can leak.

Sustainability

SL reported that the site Sustainability Group has continued to meet on a quarterly basis. Issues discussed have been the introduction of a new waste route for branded workwear; vegware for meals phased out; trialling use of waterless urinals; ran a cycle to work scheme in collaboration with Halfords. It has also held a tree plant campaign where over 300 trees were offered to colleagues on the site and local school.

STEM

SL reported that school visits to the Site have continued and thanked STEM ambassadors who give their time to inspire the next generation of innovators. Work experience opportunities will re-commence in July this year.

NRS Socio economic

SL stated that the full £1.02m NRS allocation has been used in financial year 2023-24 with £204,480 of these supporting projects close to the Wylfa site. The Morlais Tidal Energy project has received £900K to date with another £900K joint NRS/NDA committed over the next three years. Anglesey County Council North Anglesey Regeneration Plan received a further £75,000 to commission visitor economy surveys and plans to improve local tourism amenities. £9680 NRS funding allowed Inspire by Sbarduno to offer free maths GCSE revision sessions to students on Anglesey. As regards to smaller grants, £5000 was awarded to Llanelian Community Council towards a £42,000 project to rejuvenate the Lon Tyddyn Waen play area which is also used by the local Primary School.

NDA Socio- economic refresh

SL reported that the above document, following a 12-week public consultation period, was published on 5 April 2024 and is now available online.

The Chair thanked SL for his report and congratulated him and all staff on their excellent safety record; their engagement with young people throughout North West Wales; and the continued benefits to the area via the Socio-economic support grants. He then invited members to present any questions.

Question and Answer Session

VC enquired as to how SSG members can provide support. SL noted that there is very little direct interactive opportunities, however, it would be helpful and positive for the SSG members to promote NRS as a good employer for the future.

JL enquired where agency staff were from and what is their remit. SL stated that the transition process did not retain enough electricians, and the agency staff are local. There is a recruiting process underway, however, there will always be a need for occasional expertise.

LLMH thanked SL for sharing all the information and requested that he relays the SSG members gratitude of all their hard work to all site staff.

GOJ wished to congratulate staff on all safety aspects reflected within the report. He was also pleased to note continued employment of young people and asked what experiences they

receive that they can take with them in the future. SL noted that there were undoubtedly fewer opportunities than in previous years. The younger members of staff learn good basic skills delivered by Team Leaders that are encouraged to mentor.

GWR stated the importance of relaying this kind of information outside this forum and enquired if there was a staff vacancy system in place. SL confirmed that all vacancies that are advertised externally in a way that is accessible to all, however, current vacancies are very few.

GWR asked if it was possible to have open nights on site for parents. SL stated that concerted efforts are made by staff to engage directly with the schools.

VC referred to the benefits of the proposed Free Island high profile jobs board.

Members expressed concern regarding the capacity of the current 400kv transmission line to support future developments. SL noted that this query required a National Grid response.

6 NRS Corporate update

Mr Bill Hamilton External Affairs Director for NRS was welcomed to the meeting.

He gave a brief presentation on corporate issues summarised as follows: -

- Ongoing work with the workforce to develop a 10-year strategy as SL had previously described.
- A polling company has undertaken work to engage with young people across the northwest region. This work is yet to be completed but it is envisaged that a video will be presented to members at the next SSG meeting in October.
- There will be further engagement events around the area, however as Wylfa no longer has a Visitors Centre NRS will explore other venues and means for full engagement.

Question and Answer session.

GWR noted that there are several venues on the Island that could accommodate further engagement activities.

The Chair thanked BH for his update.

7. Nuclear Decommissioning Authority

David Wallace was welcomed to the meeting as the new representative for the NDA for Wales and Scotland. He referred to the following:-

- In Scotland the NDA are currently reviewing Parliamentary engagement and what can be learned from each other in order to achieve a consistent approach. To this end a cross party group has been established and has met for the first-time last week to look at decommissioning and environmental 'clean-up' DW noted that the relationship with elected representatives seems better in Wales.
- Regional Stakeholder event held in Bangor University was well attended and beneficial to highlight nuclear expertise in Wales, and to ensure engagement with young people.
- The SSG Chairs event in Manchester confirmed the importance of the SSG's and that its role and remit need to be publicised more.
- Currently looking at venues for the next face-to-face event – members will be kept updated.
- A Biannual Stakeholder Survey to be agreed.
- The NDA Strategy 5 to be published March 2026
- GDF Stakeholder engagement continues.
- NDA graduate programme has reopened.
- The NDA and the Nuclear Institute Young Generation Network (YGN) have announced they are extending their partnership to 2025.

Question and Answer session.

David Wilby wished to note that he was, unfortunately, unable to attend the recent NDA event in Bangor University as the invitation was short notice. DW noted this comment for future reference.

VC requested an update on the proposed GDF sites. DW confirmed that three communities remain, and whilst discussions are ongoing, it was very much a final decision for the areas.

8 Office for Nuclear Regulation Update

Tanya MacLeod summarised the report previously circulated with the meeting papers. She was pleased to note all Inspections undertaken had been graded green – adequate, which is the highest level. She also referred to the move to a 4-day working week and that a project assessment report recorded no significant changes/ issues.

Question and Answer session.

None presented.

9 Natural Resources Wales / Environmental Agency Update

A joint NRW/EA report for the period October 23 to March 24

David Wilby presented the above report. He stated an inspection conducted in January 2024 on environmental resources and gaseous radioactive waste management and no non-compliance issues were reported.

10 Great British Nuclear

The comments, questions and answers given by Great British Nuclear Representatives are not minuted as they are not formal members of the SSG.

11 Open Forum Question and Answer Session – no further questions were raised.

The Future of NRS sites

Wylfa - Site-specific report

Thinks Insight & Strategy

About the site-specific reports

The following site-specific reports have been written using data from the quantitative survey conducted by Thinks as part of their public research on behalf of NRS. Verbatim responses from the online community have also been included to illustrate the findings.

The survey asked 2100 respondents, comprising:

- **Nat rep sample:** 1000 people, demographically representative of the UK
- **Local boost:** 600 respondents who live within 40 minutes of an NRS site (50 participants in each of 12 sites)*
- **Young people boost:** A boost of 500x 11-18-year-olds

The data informing the site-specific reports comes from a combination of the local boost sample and those in the Nat rep sample who live near an NRS site. Please note that this means the base sizes for each site are small (<100). Differences between the sites are therefore to be treated indicatively, rather than as statistically significant.

It is also worth noting that views towards priorities and strategies for decommissioning are consistent across the sites, and these can be found in more detail in the full report, which contains analysis across all NRS sites and from all phases of the research (the online community, deliberative workshops and the survey).

Key findings



Residents mainly associate their local economy with tourism but think that Wylfa's site is important too

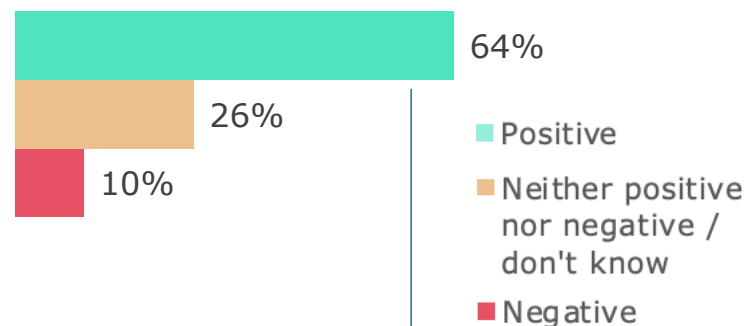
Which of the following areas do you feel has the biggest positive impact on your local economy?

Wylfa - Top 3 responses



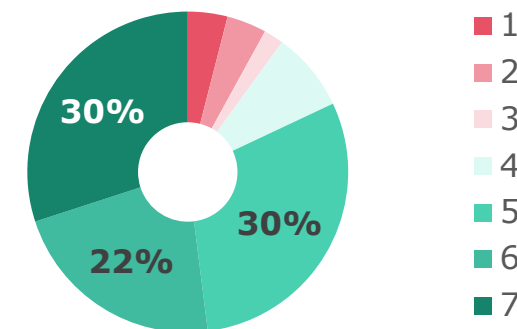
This is the **second highest proportion who selected tourism** across all sites and is more than double the sample average (32%).

Do you think your local nuclear site has had a positive or negative impact on your local area in the past 10 years?



Overall, **64%** of Wylfa's local boost think that site has had a **positive impact** in the last 10 years; this is second only to Hinkley in the sample.

Agreement with "My local nuclear power site is important for the local economy" (out of 7)

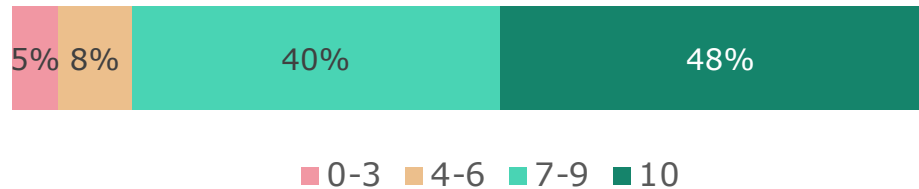


4 in 5 (82%) agree that Wylfa is 'important for the local economy'.

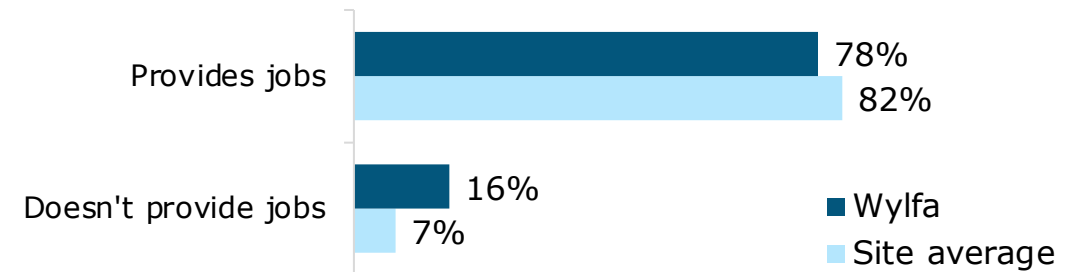
The provision of local jobs is a key concern for Wylfa's residents

Half (48%) give local jobs a score of 10/10 for importance, the highest proportion in the sample; indicating this is a key criteria for Wylfa's residents.

"The opportunities for employment have turned awful since Wylfa was decommissioned. There was a time when it seemed to be getting better when Horizon were going to build Wylfa B, but that stopped too."

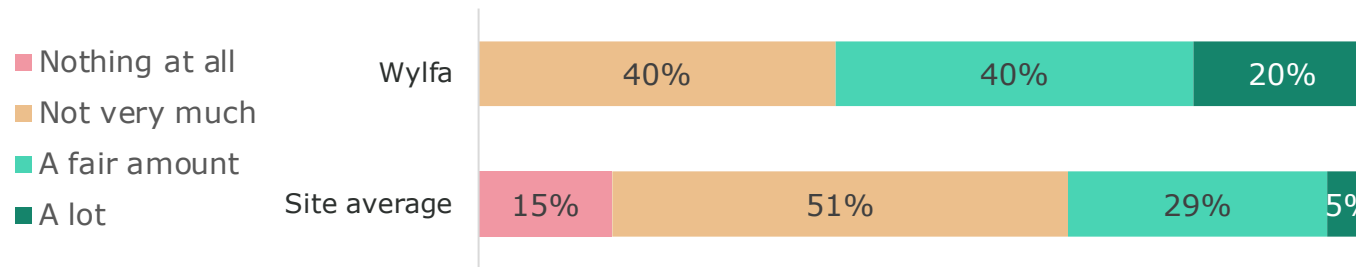

Roughly 4 in 5 (78%) in the local boost think that Wylfa provides jobs, consistent with the average across sites.

However, while it is only a minority, 16% believe that Wylfa does *not* provide jobs; this is second highest in the sample. Given the importance of local jobs to Wylfa's residents, this is an area to monitor.

How much do you feel you know about your local nuclear site?

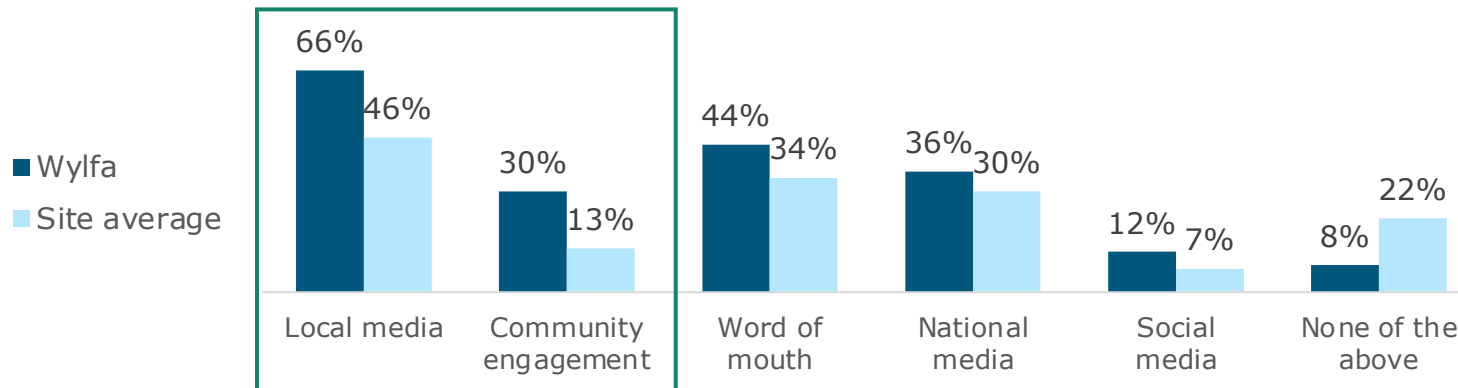


3 in 5 of the Wylfa's local boost feel they **know something** about their site (the highest in sample), of which **1 in 5** claim to know '**a lot**', which is highest across sites by a long way.

"My whole family was employed by Wylfa at some point, so we had a lot to do with the whole thing for many years. I also spent many school trips to the visitors' centre from a young age learning all about nuclear power."

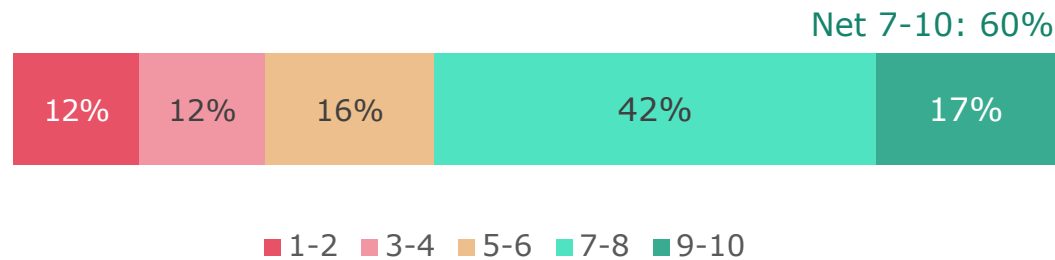
Where, if anywhere, have you heard about your local nuclear site?



Two thirds (66%) of Wylfa's local boost have heard about the site in the **local media**, while 3 in 10 (30%) have heard via **community engagement**; these scores are both high compared to other sites.

Wylfa's residents are confident in their knowledge of nuclear energy, but are mixed in terms of support

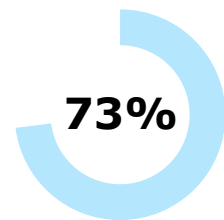
How much do you feel you know about nuclear energy in the UK?



Three fifths (60%) of Wylfa participants said they know 'a lot' about nuclear energy (7/10 or more); their mean score (6.4/10) is the **second highest across the sites**.

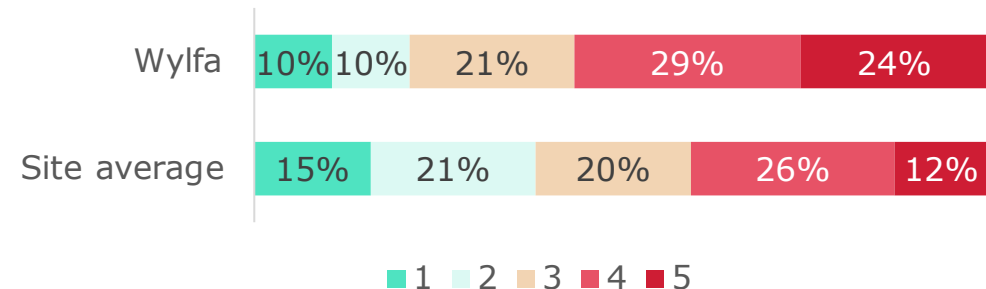
However, Wylfa has the highest mean score in sample for thinking that the **risks of nuclear outweigh the benefits** (3.5/5, vs. site average of 3/5).

Support for nuclear power to provide energy in the UK



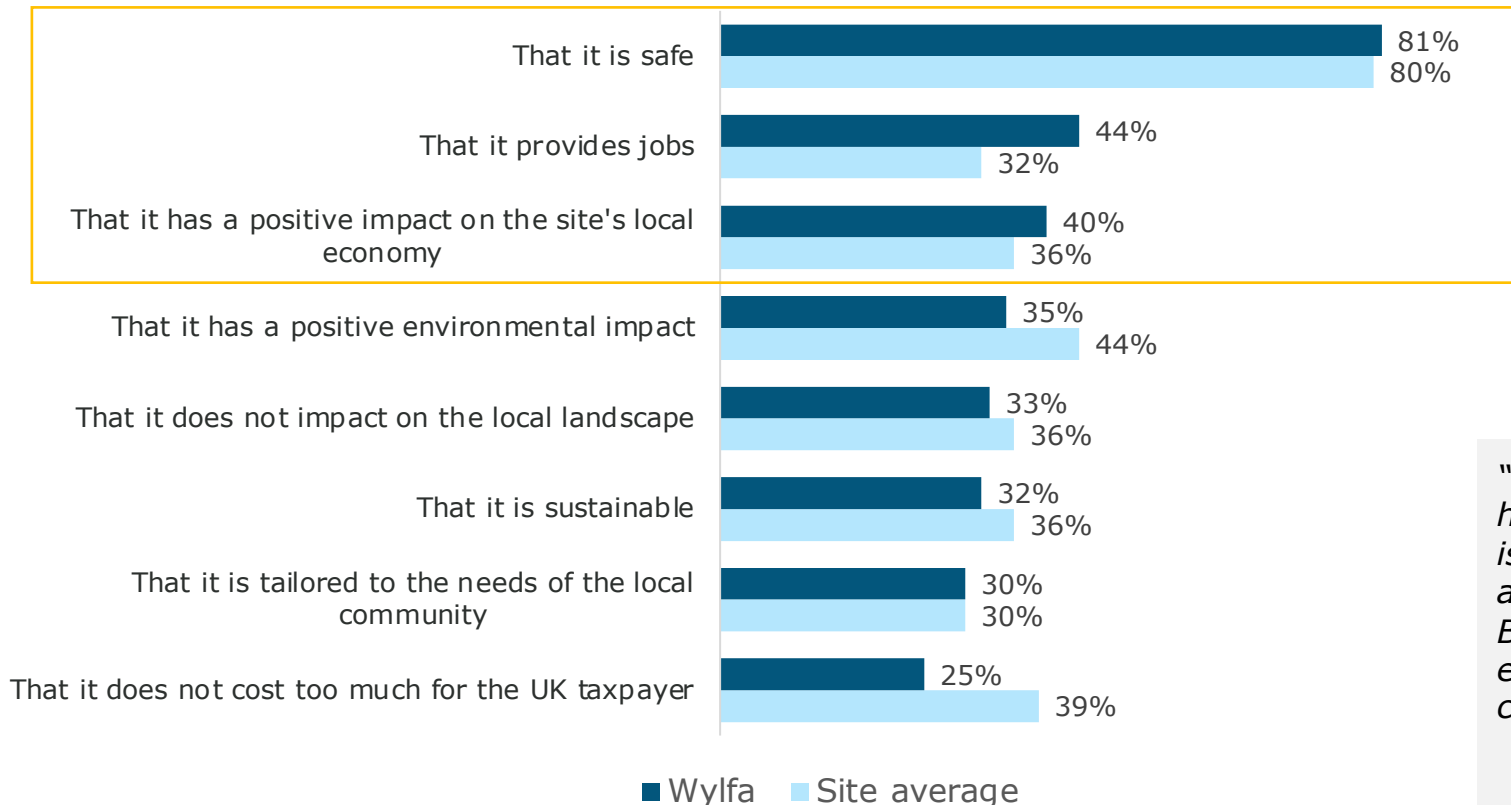
Just under three quarters (73%) of Wylfa locals **support the use of nuclear power** to provide energy in the UK, which is the average across the twelve sites.

In line with the total local sample, Wylfa's residents treat **safety** as the most important criteria for decommissioning by far (81%).

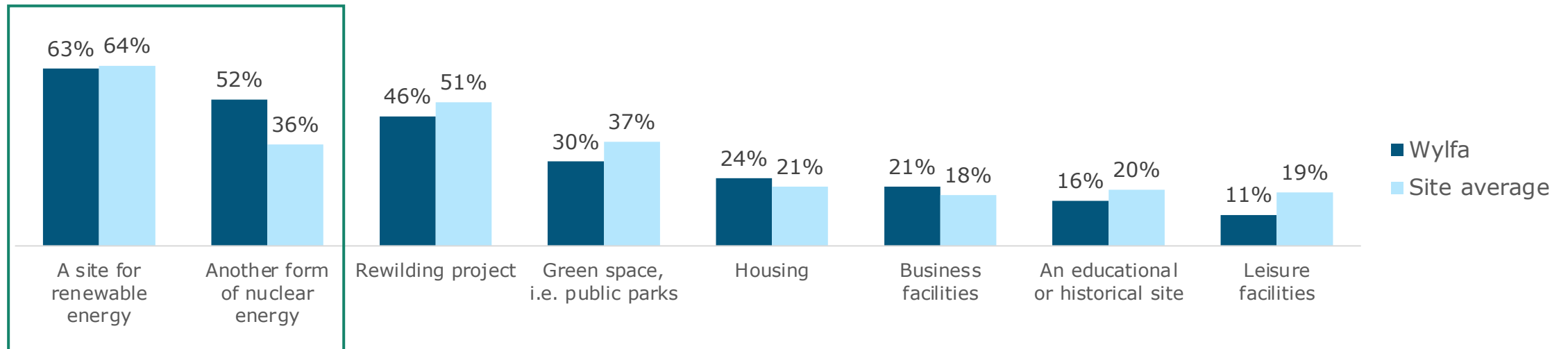
Providing jobs (44%) and having a **positive economic impact** (40%) are the other two areas where Wylfa is above the respective site average.

"I know many people who have been able to buy homes due to Wylfa, but the boom to the economy is over as of now. People are now going further afield to find work. [...] I would personally like Wylfa B to start up and go ahead so that the local economy can get a boost again and so that locals can actually work locally again."

Residents are in favour of using Wylfa's site for another form of renewable or nuclear energy

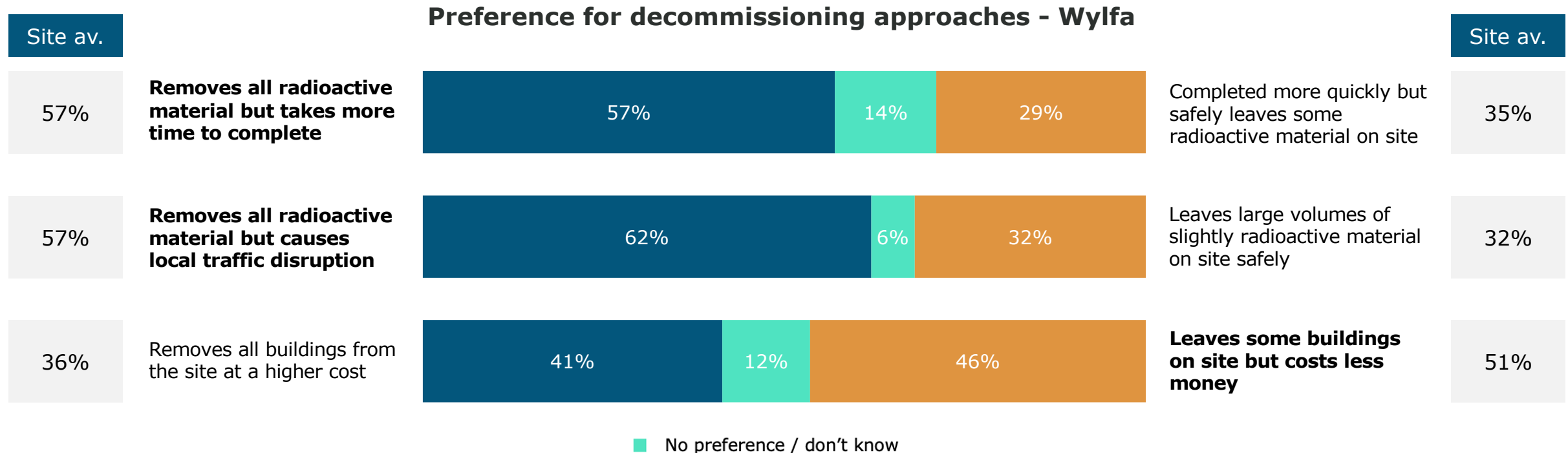
What would you like the future use of your local site to be, after it has been decommissioned? Showing % ranked in top 3 choices



3 in 5 (63%) select **a site for renewable energy** in their top three choices, in line with the average local boost.

Meanwhile, half the Wylfa sample (52%) include **another form of nuclear energy** in their top three preferences - the highest score for this option out of any site.

In line with the total local sample, Wylfa's residents favor removing all buildings and radioactive materials, despite more time and traffic disruption



Residents are more mixed when it comes to the trade off between removing buildings and lowering costs, however Wylfa is more likely to prioritise removing buildings compared to the average across the other sites.

NDA Stakeholder Update

Please find below a brief update on main points of interest since the last meeting.

General Election

Following the General Election the Labour Party, with Sir Keir Starmer as the new UK Prime Minister, won with a majority of c170. Within the Department for Energy and Net Zero the Rt Hon Ed Miliband has been appointed as the new Secretary of State with his team of Rt Hon Lord Hunt OBE as Minister of State for Energy and Net Zero, Sarah Jones MP as Minister of State for Industry, Kerry McCarty MP as Parliamentary Under Secretary for Climate, Miatta Fahnbulleh MP, Parliamentary Under Secretary for Energy Consumers and Michael Shanks MP as Parliamentary Under Secretary for Energy.

The new Secretary of State has advised the priorities for the department are:

1. delivering our mission to boost energy independence and cutting bills through clean power by 2030
2. taking back control of our energy with Great British Energy
3. upgrading Britain's homes and cutting fuel poverty through our Warm Homes Plan
4. standing up for consumers by reforming our energy system
5. creating good jobs in Britain's industrial heartlands, including a just transition for the industries based in the North Sea
6. leading on international climate action, based on our domestic achievements

The announcement and launch of Great British Energy (GBE), a publicly owned, clean-energy company which will be headquartered in Scotland has now been made by the Secretary of State. The aim is to speed up the deployment of mature and new technologies, as well as local energy projects, to support the government's aim of decarbonising the UK's electricity system by 2030 whilst also ensuring we can meet future demand as we further decarbonise the economy. GBE will be paid for by a windfall tax on oil and gas giants and will invest clean power projects all across the United Kingdom. [Juergen Maier](#), former CEO of Siemens UK, has been announced as Chair of Great British Energy.

- Following the election we have seen significant constituency level change at NDA sites with ten now represented by a new MP
- We are contacting new constituency MPs at and around our sites and Ministers in key Whitehall departments introducing the work of the NDA group and seeking an early meeting.



- Additionally, over the coming weeks and months, we will be working through the policy implications of a new government for the NDA group.

Board updates

- As previously announced **Adrienne Kelbie CBE**, Chair of Nuclear Waste Services (NWS) board, will be stepping down over Summer 2024 and her successor has been announced as Liz Peace.
- **Harriet Kemp** recently (30th August) joined the NDA board. She has extensive background and experience in HR matters and remuneration matters including working at Compass Plc, Novartis and Pepsi.

Outreach activities

- During the pre-election period outreach activities was limited but a number of planned commitments which were postponed are now being rescheduled. This included a site visit by the new Energy Minister Lord Hunt. Lord Hunt recorded a short video after his visit which can be watched on the Sellafield Ltd Facebook [page](#)

Engagement priorities for 2024

- We recently held our **Stakeholder Conference** on September 17/18 in Manchester. We'd like to thank all those that attended and engaged and if you haven't already we'd like to encourage you to provide us with feedback via [Slido](#). In due course we'll be putting up videos from the event so check out the [NDA linked In page](#). During the event David Peattie announced that the NDA would be investing an extra £5m over the next five years to support around 20 PhDs. This builds on the current annual spend of £45m in early careers, including apprenticeships, graduates and PhDs.
- In response to previous feedback, the first **SSG Chairs and Vice-Chairs event** to reflect a group-wide approach involving the NDA, NRS and other OpCo CEOs was held on July 8/9. This combined event provided richer discussion and a chance for the SSG delegates to talk about their opportunities and challenges. It also featured updates on socio-economics and the NDA's heritage strategy.
- As mentioned in previous updates, our **independent review into the SSGs** is underway. This exercise will provide an opportunity to reflect on the successes of the stakeholder voice in the local community over the last 20 years. It will also allow us to consider how best to address some of the challenges that face us as we think about the future. Our Chairs and Vice-Chairs played a role in helping to draft the scope of the review and they received a short progress update at the SSG Chairs and Vice-Chairs meeting mentioned above.
- We are in the process of developing and designed our next broad **stakeholder survey**. More details will be available in due course.
- Preparation is underway for **Strategy V** which we expect to publish in March 2026. Our strategy document is published every 5 years and describes our high-level



approach to delivering our mission. Within that we identify several critical enablers essential to the successful delivery of our mission including public and stakeholder engagement. We will engage early with stakeholders during the development of the document and its subsequent consultation.

- We are working closely with the Nuclear Industries Association (NIA) to establish a **Cross-Party Group** on the Civil Nuclear Industry in the Welsh Parliament. The aim is to have its first meeting in November 2024.

Publications, public service and policy updates

- The previous Government and devolved administrations published an updated policy for nuclear decommissioning and managing radioactive substances, including radioactive waste. Publication follows consultation undertaken last year on the proposals. [Read details of the policy here.](#)
- The policy included an expectation that the NDA should explore with stakeholders the potential for optimising the LLW Repository to take suitable, less hazardous intermediate level waste.
- Engagement with the local community and relevant stakeholders will be an important part of this work, alongside further technical evaluation. If appropriate, the project would proceed to creation of a final business case and seek necessary approvals.
- Nuclear Waste Services will be working with relevant key stakeholders to inform its thinking
- We expect to publish our Annual Report and Accounts in October
- The Scottish Government is about to start its review into its policy for higher activity radioactive waste (HAW). The policy framework is set out in a 2011 Policy and the 2016 Implementation Strategy. The anticipated timeline is: Commence review – mid 2024, Hold a public consultation – early 2025, issue a revised Policy document – late 2025.
- The new nuclear industry skills “roadmap” has been launched aimed at attracting and retaining the sector’s workforce of the future. The National Nuclear Strategic Plan for Skills (Skills Plan) is based on sector collaboration, investment in training, leadership development and improving diversity. The NDA is a signatory to the charter, which was signed at Westminster, that underpins the goal to double the number of new apprenticeships by 2026 and recruit 40,000 new jobs by 2030.
- The **NAO value for money study** into whether Sellafield and the NDA are taking a sustainable approach to decommissioning, leading to permanent hazard reduction is underway, with visits to Sellafield and formal interviews now completed. We expect the study to be published on 25 October.
- We have recently published our **Nuclear Heritage Strategy**. The NDA are tasked with decommissioning the UK’s legacy nuclear sites, sites and facilities which have been at the heart of delivering nuclear benefits for the UK, including national defence programmes and supplying safe, low-carbon power, for decades.



- The [heritage strategy](#) enables the NDA group to identify and preserve the tangible and intangible assets, objects, and memories of the nuclear industry, the people who worked in it, and the communities that supported it.
- NDA has published its **Socio Economic Report** for 2023/24, detailing a record investment in projects across the UK - [NDA group investing in our communities - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](#)

Mission delivery

- Future plans for our Chapelcross site in Dumfries and Galloway were unveiled in August, with a long-term vision to develop the site into a Green Energy Hub: [Chapelcross Masterplan - CX Project](#)
- NWS and the NDA have established an innovative partnership for the enhanced management of asbestos waste, awarding two contracts to establish the **Asbestos Innovation Partnership**. This partnership will work with the NDA group and the supply chain, to test and develop new solutions to treat asbestos waste, helping to deliver efficiencies and enable more effective waste management.
- A collaboration between NRS, NTS and NWS has achieved a significant milestone by transporting the final waste from the Treated Radwaste Store (TRS) in Winfrith to the LLWR for disposal. The completion of this project ahead of schedule means that the need for **waste storage at Winfrith** which closed in 1990 has been removed, leaving the site ready for decommissioning.
- NDA and NRS have underlined their commitment to Government to, where possible, safely accelerate **land release at Harwell** site to maximise the economic impact of decommissioning. We have identified clear areas of strategic importance and will work together with the Harwell Campus joint venture on developing options for those areas. We are at early stages and still progressing the current release of plots, aiming to have a broader plan for land release this autumn.
- At Sellafield, the first transfer of fuel from an A1 skip to the new 63 can rack in support of the AGR programme has been made. This is a significant milestone presenting new capability that will, via further 63 can racks, enable storage of the volumes of EDF fuel needed into the 2030s.
- The hearing for the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) charges against Sellafield Ltd under the Nuclear Industries Security Regulations 2003 took place on 20 June at Westminster Magistrates Court in London. Sellafield Ltd entered a guilty plea to all charges. The sentence was pronounced on 2nd October with a fine of £332,500.00 being imposed.

2. Routine matters

2.1. Inspections

Inspections are undertaken as part of the process for monitoring compliance with:

- the conditions attached by ONR to the nuclear site licence granted under the Nuclear Installations Act 1965 (NIA65) (as amended);
- the Energy Act 2013;
- the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 (HSWA74); and
- regulations made under HSWA74, for example the Ionising Radiations Regulations 2017 (IRR17) and the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (MHSWR99).

The inspections entail monitoring the licensee's actions on the site in relation to incidents, operations, maintenance, projects, modifications, safety case changes and any other matters that may affect safety. The licensee is required to make and implement adequate arrangements under the conditions attached to the licence in order to ensure legal compliance. Inspections seek to judge both the adequacy of these arrangements and their implementation.

In this period, routine inspections of Wylfa covered the following:

- radioactive waste management
- decommissioning
- quality assurance and records
- conventional (non-nuclear) health and safety
- security

2.2. Other work

4. Regulatory activity

ONR may issue formal documents to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. Under nuclear site licence conditions, ONR issues regulatory documents, which either permit an activity or require some form of action to be taken; these are usually collectively termed 'Licence Instruments' (LIs) but can take other forms. In addition, inspectors may take a range of enforcement actions, to include issuing an Enforcement Notice.

- No LIs, Enforcement Notices or Enforcement letters were issued during this period.

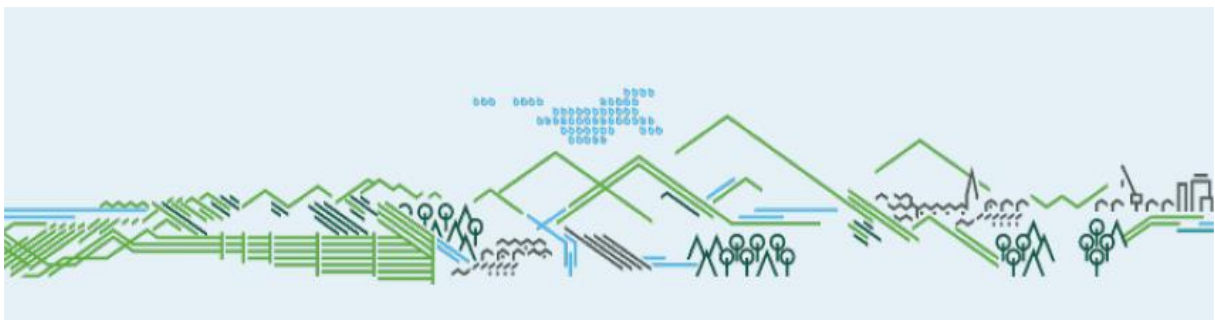

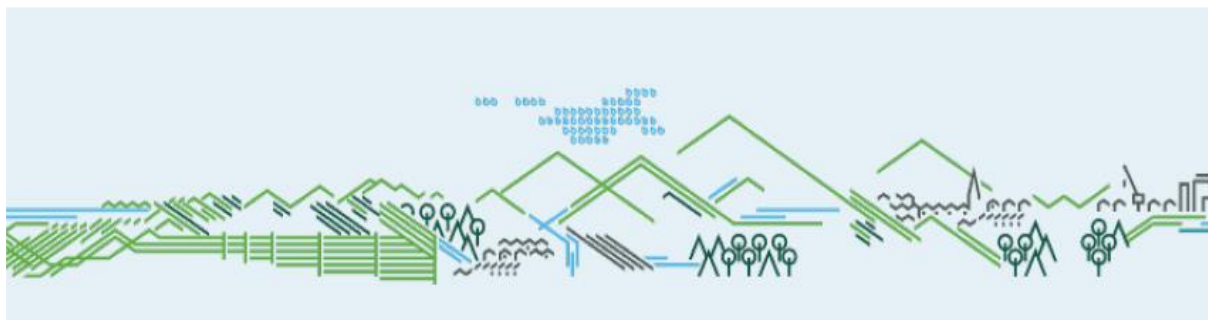

FOREWORD

This report is issued to the Site Stakeholder Group (SSG) to provide a brief summary of the regulatory activities of Natural Resources Wales (NRW) relating to the Wylfa nuclear site.

NRW is accountable to the Welsh Government for the environmental regulation of nuclear sites in Wales. NRW has a contractual arrangement in place which enables them to draw on the experience and resources of the Environment Agency's specialist Nuclear Regulation Group, to assist in the delivery of on-site inspection work and associated assessments.

We regulate the disposal of radioactive waste, operation of combustion plant, discharges to water and conventional waste. Please see Annex 1 for further information on our role.



Introduction

This report covers the period from April 2024 to September 2024.

Inspections

We carried out an inspection in September 2024 on radioactive waste management at Wylfa. Specifically, we reviewed implementation of the new Waste Information Management System (WIMS); waste characterisation and consignment processes; and plans for Dry Store Cell 4 de-planting. We did not identify any non-compliances. We will report back to NRS with our recommendations when our assessment is complete.

Discharges

Radioactive discharges to air and water from Wylfa were within permitted limits in this reporting period. Non-radioactive discharges to water were also within permitted limits.

Environmental monitoring

We received the environmental monitoring programme results as required by the RSA permit. During this reporting period one passive shade sampler exceeded the mean plus 4 standard deviations of the previous 12 results for Be-7 in April 2024, however this is natural radioactivity. Two Thermoluminescent Dosimeters were lost within the Q2 2024 exposure period and were therefore unable to be collected and reported.

Permitting

We received a request from NRS in February 2024 for changes to the Dry Store Cell 5 ventilation discharge point in the Compilation of Environment Agency Requirements, Approvals and Specifications (CEAR). The proposal involved removing corroded pipework and changing the location of the discharge point. We assessed the proposed changes and agreed to them. The supporting permit documents were updated to record our agreement in May 2024.

Magnox Limited changed name to Nuclear Restoration Services Limited in October 2023. We received a permit variation application regarding this change and the permits and supporting documents for Wylfa will be updated to reflect this change at the next available opportunity.

Events and enforcement

We regularly review summaries of all events reported and discuss those relevant to environmental compliance with NRS Ltd. as part of our routine regulation.

In August 2024 NRS Ltd. told us about an issue they had discovered in their monitoring of discharges from Dry Store Cell 5. NRS is investigating the issue and will report back to us with the results of their investigation when it is complete. We will assess the issue when we have more information available.

Annex 1: The role of Natural Resources Wales and the Environment Agency at nuclear sites

Operating and cleaning up nuclear sites generates radioactive and non-radioactive wastes. Our role as the environmental regulator is to ensure that the impact of those wastes on people and the environment, now and in the future, is as small as it can be. We also aim to prevent pollution, enhance the environment, and contribute to the sustainable development of the UK.

We inspect nuclear sites and assess proposals from operators, to provide assurance that the operator is complying with the limits and conditions of the permits we issue under the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2016 (as amended) and other relevant legislation and policy.

We supplement direct regulation with a partnership approach, working with the operators, the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) and the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) to solve problems jointly.

We expect operators to comply fully with all relevant legislative requirements and permits. If this does not happen, we will not hesitate to use our enforcement powers to ensure that action is taken to protect the environment or to secure compliance.

In summary our objectives are to:

- Ensure that environmental permits are up to date, flexible and fit for purpose and that they drive environmental improvement
- Assess compliance with the limits and conditions of the permits
- Reduce risks to the environment and avoid creating further legacies
- Ensure that integrated waste strategies continue to improve
- Ensure that solid waste is packaged in a form suitable for disposal
- Ensure that infrastructure and assets are maintained to minimise environmental impact
- Develop guidance on Best Available Techniques (BAT)
- Influence NDA so that they provide appropriate direction to operators to minimise waste and improve environmental outcomes
- Encourage integrated management of fuel and nuclear materials so as to prevent or minimise the potential environmental impacts
- Ensure land and groundwater contaminated by radioactivity or other pollutants is managed appropriately and protect land and groundwater from further contamination
- Monitor and assess organisational change to ensure that environmental performance is maintained
