Amlinellodd SL y canlynol fel prosiectau â blaenoriaeth ar gyfer 2025-2026:

- System troshaen drydanol – Mae hyn yn caniatáu gosod ceblau EOS newydd ar y Safle.
- Dadhalogi Cell Storio Sych 4 – Mae'r prosiect hwn yn cael ei ystyried.
- Cael gwared ag asbestos o adeiladau'r adweithyddion – Mae'r prosiect hwn yn amcangyfrif hyd a lled y gwaith yn y dyfodol.

- Datgomisiynu neuadd y tyrbîn ac adeiladau ategol. Mae Wylfa wedi cyrraedd carreg filltir bwysig drwy dynnu'r holl bibellau (*air gapping*) yn fecanyddol o fewn pedwar twnnel ceblau dynodedig. Mae hwn yn gam tuag at wahanu a datgysylltu neuadd y tyrbîn yn barhaol oddi wrth weddill y safle, gan ei pharatoi ar gyfer ei dymchwel.
- Dylunio ac adeiladu offer adfer Gwastraff Lefel Ganolraddol – mae cafn yr ardal llenwi fflasgiau bellach yn ddarfodedig, ac mae'r prosiect hwn yn datblygu'r sgôp ar gyfer ei waredu yn y pen draw.

Rhaglen ddatgomisiynu

Nodwyd bod pob prosiect ar y trywydd iawn. Fodd bynnag, gallai cyllid yn y dyfodol effeithio ar gynnydd pellach. Dangoswyd fideo byr i'r aelodau ar dynnu asbestos o adweithyddion, dan reolaeth Tîm Altrad ar y safle.

Pontio ar gyfer gorsaf ynni dŵr Maentwrog

Fe wnaeth y cyfrifoldebau rheoli ar gyfer Maentwrog symud o Wylfa i Drawsffynydd ddechrau mis Rhagfyr. Nod y cam strategol hwn yw gwella effeithlonrwydd gweithredol a rheoli adnoddau, oherwydd bod Trawsfynydd yn agosach at Faentwrog. Disgwylir i'r newid symleiddio gweithrediadau, gwella'r cydgysylltiad â gweithrediadau a chynnal rhagoriaeth barhaus yng Ngorsaf Ynni Dŵr Maentwrog. Bydd y tîm o 7 yn cael cymorth yn ôl yr angen gan Gyfarwyddwr Safle Trawsfynydd.

Meysydd i'w Gwella

- Canlyniadau Legionella Uchel: Mae trefn fflysio well ar waith ac yn cael ei hadolygu'n barhaus. Ble mae'r canlyniadau wedi dangos risg uwch, nid yw'r cyfleusterau hynny'n cael eu defnyddio mwyach. Nid oes unrhyw broblemau iechyd ar y safle ar hyn o bryd.
- Diraddiad a methiant offer: Mae dirywiad a chrydiad rhai strwythurau wedi cael eu nodi. Bydd mwy o wyladwriaeth, rheoli diffygion ac asedau yn helpu i flaenoriaethu gwaith atgyweirio neu waredu. Mae'r gwaith o adolygu a rhesymoli larymau blaenoriaeth hefyd yn mynd rhagddo.

Cwblhawyd gwelliannau hanfodol i'r Prif Gatiau i Gerbydau yn dilyn pryderon diogelwch a amlygwyd mewn adroddiad ar gyflwr asedau. Gwnaed y gwaith yn fewnol, gan arbed dros £300,000.

STEM

Mae'r ymweliadau STEM yn gyfle i ymgysylltu, ysbrydoli a dangos i fyfyrwyr yr effaith y gallant ei chael ym maes ynni niwclear. Adroddodd SL ar amserlen ymweliadau 2024/2025, a llongyfarchodd staff Wylfa am eu hangerdd a'u hymroddiad wrth drefnu'r digwyddiadau.

Cynllun economaidd-gymdeithasol Gwasanaethau Adfer Niwclear (NRS) 2024-2025 Wylfa ar daith

Yn ddiweddar, aeth Wylfa ar daith o amgylch y cymunedau cyfagos i hyrwyddo llwyddiannau datgomisiynu diweddar. Cafodd ymwelwyr gyfle i gwrdd â'r tîm a dysgu mwy am genhadaeth NRS i ddatgomisiynu safleoedd niwclear ac ymchwil y genhedlaeth gyntaf ledled y DU yn ddiogel.

Yr wybodaeth ddiweddaraf am brosiectau aml-flwyddyn M-SParc

Sicrhodd Parc Gwyddoniaeth M-SParc £389,000 (£129,667 eleni) gan NRS dros y tair blynedd nesaf i barhau i ariannu'r Tîm Carbon Isel, yn dilyn cyllid blaenorol gan yr NDA. Dyma uchafbwyntiau cyflawniadau eu hadroddiad diwethaf:

- Sicrhawyd £624,500 i ddatgarboneiddio M-SParc.
- Trefnwyd digwyddiad yn ystod Wythnos Niwclear Senedd y DU (NWIP) gyda Chydweithrediad Rhanbarthau Niwclear y DU.
- Mae'r tîm yn datblygu cyfres o ddigwyddiadau - '*Egni Conversations*', gan gyflwyno cyfres o weithdai gyda rhanddeiliaid allweddol ar ystod o bynciau, gan gynnwys pryder am yr hinsawdd, diogelwch bwyd, a chydbwyso'r grid.
- Darparu cymorth i ysgrifennu ceisiadau drwy brosiect Uchelgais Gogledd Cymru.
- Gweithio tuag at gwblhau'r gwaith o drydaneiddio adeilad M-SParc, gan gyrraedd tua 85% o'r ffordd tuag at Sero Net, gan anelu i fod y parc gwyddoniaeth Sero Net cyntaf yn y DU.
- Parhau i gynnal digwyddiadau STEM. Yn ystod NWIP Cymdeithas y Diwydiant Niwclear (NIA), lansiodd M-SParc eu chwe fideo byr newydd yn esbonio pŵer niwclear.

Prosiect Ymchwil Nodweddu Morol (MCRP) Morlais

Uchafbwyntiau cyflawniadau eu hadroddiad diwethaf:

- Mae Morlais wedi llwyddo i sicrhau £8m o gyllid gan Lywodraeth Cymru i ehangu'r cysylltiad â'r grid yng Nghaergybi er mwyn allforio mwy o gapasiti pan fydd yn gwbl weithredol o'r flwyddyn nesaf ymlaen.
- Mae defnyddio bwi Marinus yn llwyddiannus, sydd wedi'i ffitio ag offer SIMA (System Dadansoddi a Monitro Integredig), yn gyflawniad sylweddol i MCRP. Bydd yr offer integredig yn caniatáu i Seiche a MarineSitu ddatblygu system Cynllun Lliniaru a Monitro Amgylcheddol (EMMP) weithredol y gellir ei defnyddio ar dyrbin dan y môr yn 2025. Mae hyn yn mynd i'r afael â gofynion y rheoleiddiwr a bydd yn darparu data er budd y diwydiant.

Mae prosiectau cymdogion da a gefnogwyd yn ddiweddar yn cynnwys:

- Clwb Pêl-droed Bae Cemaes - £485 i brynu gasebos.
- Clwb Pêl-droed Hotspurs Caergybi - £900 i brynu offer hyfforddi a chit yn arddangos brand NRS ar gyfer y tîm dan 17 oed.
- Clwb Rygbi Llangejni - £900 i brynu hwdis yn arddangos brand NRS ar gyfer y tîm dan 12 oed.

Yn ogystal, dyrannwyd £9,680 i *Inspire* gan Sbarduno i gyflwyno sesiwn adolygu TGAU dwyieithog yn rhad ac am ddim yn ystod gwyliau'r Pasg.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i SL am ei adroddiad manwl a'i longyfarch ar lwyddiant Diogelwch y Safle a Phrentisiaethau.

Sesiwn Holi ac Ateb

Gwahoddodd y Cadeirydd yr aelodau i gyflwyno unrhyw gwestiynau.

Roedd GOJ yn dymuno ailadrodd sylwadau'r Cadeirydd ynghylch y gwaith rhagorol sy'n cael ei wneud yn Wylfa i ymgysylltu â phobl ifanc a'u cefnogi drwy ddarparu cyfleoedd addysgol a gwaith. Cyfeiriodd yn benodol at stori newyddion genedlaethol ddiweddar ar S4C yn tynnu sylw at y cyfleoedd hyn.

Yn ogystal, roedd yn dymuno llongyfarch Tom Williams, Cyfarwyddwr newydd Safle Trawsfynydd, ar ei benodiad diweddar, gan nodi ei fod yn gyn-ddisgybl yn Ysgol Bodedern ar yr Ynys.

Diolchodd SL i'r aelodau am eu cefnogaeth, gan ganmol y gwaith rhagorol a wnaed gan Ffion Morris, y Rheolwr Peirianeg, a'i hangerdd wrth gefnogi'r bobl ifanc.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i SL am ei gyflwyniad.

- Wylfa oedd y safle cyntaf i gynnal digwyddiad ymgysylltu 'manwl' gyda'i gymuned. Ymwelodd trelar Sioe Deithiol Gymunedol â Chemaes, Amlwch, Llanfechell a Llangejni.

- Cynhaliwyd cyfweiliadau dros y ffôn hefyd gan *Thinks Insight*, gyda chyfranogwyr yn cael eu dewis o ardal o fewn radiws o 20 milltir i Wylfa. Gofynnwyd cwestiynau am ddatgomisiynu ac am safbwyntiau'r gymuned. Nodwyd bod cefnogaeth gref i bŵer niwclear newydd yn yr ardal, a'r farn bod yn rhaid i'r broses ddatgomisiynu gael ei chyflawni'n gadarn ac yn effeithlon. Nodwyd hefyd bod dealltwriaeth dda o NRS a'i rôl.
- Cynhaliwyd tri Grŵp Ffocws yn yr ardal a oedd yn cynnwys pobl o ystod eang o oeddrannau. Y safbwyntiau allweddol oedd bod diogelwch ac ymgysylltu â'r gymuned yn hollbwysig.

Cyfeiriodd BH at yr ad-drefnu yn rheolaeth NRS, sydd wedi arwain at gael gwared ar haen o reolaeth. Nododd BH bod disgwyl i'r wybodaeth am yr Adolygiad o Wariant am y tair blynedd nesaf fod ar gael ym mis Mehefin 2025.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i BH am ei gyflwyniad a gwahoddodd gwestiynau gan y rheini a oedd yn bresennol.

Sesiwn Holi ac Ateb

Holodd y Cynghorydd GWR a oedd ystyriaeth yn cael ei rhoi i orsaf lawn, yn hytrach nag adweithyddion modiwl bach (SMR) yn unig. Sicrhodd BH yr aelodau fod yr holl opsiynau'n cael eu trafod yn barhaus. Dywedodd y Cynghorydd GWR ei bod yn bwysig cydweithio gyda'r NRS, SSG, AS, AC a Chyngor Sir Ynys Môn tuag at orsaf niwclear lawn yn Wylfa.

Roedd y Cynghorydd DO yn dymuno ailadrodd pa mor bwysig oedd hi fod yr NRS yn hyrwyddo ei rôl yn y gymuned. Cytunodd BH fod ymgysylltu â'r gymuned yn hollbwysig, a bod ystyriaeth yn cael ei rhoi ar hyn o bryd i osod canolfannau gwybodaeth (gyda sgriniau cyffwrdd) mewn ardaloedd hygrych yn lleol.

Dymunai'r Cynghorydd JL hysbysu'r aelodau bod yr Aelod Seneddol a'r Aelod o'r Senedd dros Ynys Môn yn codi cwestiynau'n barhaus ynghylch dyfodol Wylfa yng Nghaerdydd ac yn Llundain.

- Mae'r Adroddiad Blynyddol, sy'n nodi'r cynnydd a wnaed yn erbyn cenhadaeth yr NDA, o ddatgomisiynu safleoedd presennol yn ddiogel i baratoi i ysgwyddo'r cyfrifoldeb am fwy, ar yr un pryd â rheoli gwastraff ymbelydrol ar gyfer y rhaglen bresennol a niwclear newydd, ar gael ar wefan yr NDA.
- Cynhaliwyd Arolwg Rhanddeiliaid ar-lein eleni a nodwyd bod nifer o unigolion wedi ei lenwi.

1 Welcome and Receive Apologies for Absence

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting and noted the absences as recorded above.

He welcomed back Jonathon Jenkins from the NDA after a period of secondment. He also welcomed Katie Chandler newly appointed ONR Inspector for Wylfa and thanked Tanya McLeod for her valued contribution to the SSG wishing her well in her new appointment. He also welcomed the return of Cllr Ken Hughes following his recent re-election to IoACC Talybolion constituency.

2. Approval of Minutes of the Meeting held 17.10.24

The minutes of the meeting held 17.10.24, circulated prior to the meeting, were received, and accepted as a true record.

3 Matters Arising from the Previous Minutes

None raised.

4 SSG Chairman's Report

The Chair gave a brief update as follows:

- Expressed concern regarding the recent NRS spending review and the implications of a reduced allocation over the coming years.
- He noted that it has been 20 years since the NDA was established and that it is proposed to review the SSG's future role and responsibilities.

5 Wylfa Site Director's Report

SL presented the Site update report summarised as follows: -

SL reported on the safety statistics as follows:-

- Total recorded incident rate (TRIR): 0.00
- Days away case rate (DACR) 0.00
- Number of days since a lost time accident: 2475days (as at 02.04.25)

People

Wylfa One Team

- 184 NRS site staff
- 77 NRS based at the Wylfa Hub.
- Staff have recently completed the Annual Employee Engagement Survey – 82% completion rate.

Apprentices

The apprentice intake for August 2025 has commenced with 25.4.25 being the closing date.

Business Planning at Wylfa

SL outlined the following as priority projects for 2025-6.

- Electrical overlay system – This allows for the installation of new EOS cabling to Site
- Dry Store Cell 4 decontamination – This project is being scoped up
- Reactor buildings asbestos removal -This project is estimating the future works
- Turbine hall and associated buildings decommissioning. Wylfa has achieved a significant milestone by mechanically air gapping all pipework within four designated cable tunnels. This is a step towards the separation and permanent disconnection of the turbine hall from the rest of the site, preparing it for demolition.
- Intermediate Level Waste recovery equipment design and build - flask filling area trough is now obsolete and this project is building up the scope for its ultimate disposal

Site update:

Decommissioning programme

It was noted that all projects are on target, however, future funding may affect further progress. Members were shown a short video on Reactor Asbestos removal, managed by the Altrad Team on site.

Transition for Maentwrog hydropower station

Management responsibilities for Maentwrog have transitioned from Wylfa to Trawsfynydd as of early December. This strategic move aims to enhance operational efficiency and resource management due to Trawsfynydd's closer proximity to Maentwrog. The change is expected to streamline operations and improve coordination with operations and sustained excellence for Maentwrog Hydropower Station. The team of 7 are given support as and when required by the Trawsfynydd Site Director

Areas for Improvement

- High Legionella results: An enhanced flushing regime is currently in place and under constant review. Where results have indicated an elevated risk, those facilities have been taken out of use. There are no immediate health issues on site.
- Plant degradation & equipment failures: The degradation & corrosion of some structures have been noted. Increased vigilance, defect & asset management will assist with prioritising repair or removal. The review & rationalisation of priority alarms is also underway.

SL also referred to a list of drumbeat projects being developed with a day earmarked in May to promote further.

Good Practice

Refurbishment Main Access Security Gates - Bright Ideas

Completed essential improvements to the Main Vehicle Lock Gates following safety concerns highlighted in an asset condition report. The work was carried out inhouse, saving over £300k.

Sustainability

As part of NRS's sustainability initiative, all sites will implement carbon plans to

reduce emissions. For Wylfa this includes:

- Energy / Efficiency projects
- Building knowledge and sharing best practices
- Eliminate fossil fuel usage where possible
- Knowing our carbon numbers
- Low carbon procurement
- Eliminating the most carbon intensive steel and concrete products

Recent activities:

- Volunteering day for the waste team held at Tyddyn Môn
 - Purchased low energy consumption hand driers to replace existing ones in toilet facilities.
 - Outdoor wellbeing area under development-staff have voted on preferred location and the undercover picnic bench has been purchased.
- Scope of work for enabling groundwork under development
- Various energy efficiency savings are underway focussing on heating and lighting.

STEM

The STEM visits are an opportunity to engage, inspire, and show students the impact they can make in the world of nuclear energy. SL reported on the 24/25timetable of visits and congratulated Wylfa staff on their passion and dedication in organising the events.

Nuclear Restoration Services (NRS) socio-economic scheme 2024-25

Wylfa on tour

Wylfa recently went on tour around the local surrounding communities to highlight recent decommissioning success stories. Visitors had the opportunity to meet the team and learn more about NRS's mission to safely decommission the first generation nuclear and research sites across the UK

Multiyear projects update.

M-SParc

M-SParc Science Park secured £389,000 (£129,667 this year) from NRS over the next three years to continue funding the Low Carbon Team, following previous NDA funding. Highlights of achievements from their last report:

- Secured £624,500 to decarbonise M-SParc.
- Organised an event in Nuclear Week in Parliament with the UK Nuclear Regions Collaboration.
- The team are developing a series of events - 'Egni Conversations', delivering a series of workshops with key stakeholders on a range of topics including climate anxiety, food security, grid balancing.
- Delivering bid writing support through an Ambition North Wales project.
- Working towards completing the electrification of the M-SParc building, getting to around 85% of the way towards Net Zero, inspiring to be the UK's first Net Zero science park.
- Continuing to deliver STEM events. During NIA Nuclear Week in Parliament, M-Sparc launched their newly produced six bite-size videos explaining nuclear power.

Morlais Marine Characterisation Research Project (MCRP)

Highlights of achievements from their last report:

- Morlais have been successful in securing £8m Welsh Government funding to expand the grid connection at Holyhead to export increased capacity once fully operational from next year.
- Successful deployment of the Marinus buoy, fitted with the System Integrator Monitoring Analysis (SIMA) equipment is a significant achievement for the MCRP. The integrated equipment will permit Seiche and MarineSitu to develop an operational Environmental Monitoring and Mitigation Plan (EMMP) system that can be deployed on a subsea turbine in 2025. This addresses the regulator requirements and will provide data to benefit the industry.

Recently supported good neighbour projects include:

- Cemaes Bay football club - £485 to purchase gazebos
- Holyhead Hotspurs - £900 for training equipment and NRS branded kit for Under 17's
- Llangefni Rugby Club - £900 for NRS branded hoodies for Under 12's

Alo Inspire by Sbarduno was allocated £9,680 to deliver free bilingual GCSE revision session during the Easter break.

The Chair thanked SL for his detailed report and congratulated him on the Site safety and Apprenticeships success.

Question and Answer Session

The Chair invited members to present any questions.

GOJ wished to reiterate the Chair's comments regarding the excellent work undertaken at Wylfa to engage and support young people by providing educational and work opportunities. Her referred particularly to a recent national news story on S4C highlighting these opportunities.

He also wished to congratulate the new Site Director for Trawsfynydd on his recent appointment, Tom Williams being an ex-pupil of Ysgol Bodedern on the Island.

SL thanked members for their support and reiterated the excellent work undertaken by Ffion Morris, Engineering Manager, and her passion in supporting the young people.

The Chair thanked SL for his presentation.

6 NRS Corporate update

Mr Bill Hamilton, Director of External Affairs was welcomed to the meeting and provided a short presentation on Community Engagement

- Wylfa was the first site to undertake a 'deep dive' engagement event with its community. A Community Roadshow trailer visited Cemaes, Amlwch, Llanfechell and Llangefni.
- Telephone interviews were also undertaken by Thinks Insight with participants chosen from within a 20 miles radius of Wylfa. Questions were asked about decommissioning and community views. It was noted that there is strong support for new nuclear in area

and a view that the decommissioning process must be undertaken robustly and efficiently. It was also noted that there is a good understanding of NRS and its role.

- Three Focus groups were held in the area comprising of a wide range of ages. The key viewpoints were that safety and community engagement was paramount.

BH referred to the reconfiguration in NRS management resulting in removal of a layer of management.

BH noted that the information regarding the Spending Review for the next three years is expected in June 2025

The Chair thanked BH for his presentation and opened the floor to questions.

Question and Answer Session

Cllr GWR enquired as to whether consideration is being given to a full station as opposed to SMR's only. BH assured members that all options are continually being discussed. Cllr GWR stated the importance working collaboratively towards a full nuclear station at Wylfa this to include NRS,SSG, MP, AM and Isle of Anglesey County Council.

Cllr DO wished to reiterate the importance of NRS promoting its role within the community. BH agreed that community engagement is paramount, and that consideration is currently being given to establishing touchscreen information pods within accessible areas locally.

Cllr JL wished to inform members that the MP and AM for Ynys Mon continually raise questions regarding the future of Wylfa in both Cardiff and London.

7. Nuclear Decommissioning Authority

The Chair welcomed Jonathon Jenkins return to the SSG.

JJ thanked the Chair for his kind words and summarised his report previously circulated with the meeting papers.

- The Annual Report which sets out the progress made against the NDA mission, from safely decommissioning existing sites to preparing to take responsibility for more, while managing radioactive waste for the existing programme and new nuclear is available on the NDA website.
- Stakeholder Survey has been undertaken on-line this year with a good uptake recorded.
- The NDA celebrates its 20th anniversary this year, and some events are being planned around this. It is hoped to mark an SSG meeting at each site with a special presentation reviewing the progress over the last 20 years – more details will follow.
- Preparation is underway for Strategy V which is expected to publish in March 2026. The strategy will go out to consultation in July 2025 for a 3-month period.

Question and Answer session. – none received

The Chair thanked JJ his presentation.

8 Office for Nuclear Regulation Update

Tanya MacLeod presented her report for the period 1 July – 31 December 2024 previously circulated with the meeting papers. In this period, routine inspections of Wylfa covered the following:

- radioactive waste management.
- decommissioning.
- security

She also thanked the SSG for their welcome and support over the last three years noting that the group will be in good hands with her replacement, Katie Chandler

9 Natural Resources Wales / Environmental Agency Update

A joint NRW/EA report was presented by Iwan Williams NRW Manager for both Wylfa and Trawsfynydd sites and covered the period from September 2024 to March 2025

He noted that Kate Simpson has left NRW. He tendered David Wilby's apologies due to ill-health. His report was summarised as follows:

- Radioactive discharges to air and water from the Wylfa site were within permitted limits in this reporting period. Non-radioactive discharges to water were also within permitted limits.
- During this reporting period there were no unusual results as regards the environmental monitoring programme.
- A request was received from NRS in November 2024 to change the Compilation of Environment Agencies Requirements, Approvals and Specifications (CEAR). An updated CEAR was issued to NRS in February 2025.
- In August 2024 NRS Ltd. reported on an issue discovered in the monitoring of discharges from Dry Store Cell 5. NRS investigated the issue and provided a report in October. The report was reviewed, and it was concluded that sampling equipment had been incorrectly fitted to a pipe, resulting in a 6-week gap in sampling data. The error was corrected as soon as it was noticed.

Question and Answer session – none received.

The Chair thanked IW for his report and wished David Wilby a speedy recovery.

10 Open Forum Question and Answer Session – no further questions were raised.

11. Any Other Business

The Chair thanked all for their attendance and closed the meeting at 3.25 pm.

**NDA Stakeholder Update**

Please find below a brief update on main points of interest since the last meeting.

Government Update

The Government Spending Review process informs decisions on public spending. NDA group funding is made up of the funding we receive from Government and the income we generate. We have already communicated on NDA group funding for 2025/26 which, at just over £4bn, includes increased Government funding, demonstrating significant public investment in our nuclear sites and facilities though this will not be without challenges.

We have now been advised of our allocation for 2026/27 through to 2029/30 from our Government sponsoring department, the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ). This gives the NDA long term visibility of our Government funding to the end of the decade.

Despite funding challenges, we're focused on our nationally important mission to ensure the safe and efficient decommissioning of the UK's nuclear legacy, with much to deliver, including a Geological Disposal Facility (GDF), which remains government's policy for the long-term storage solution for the most hazardous radioactive waste. Additionally, we are preparing for the transition of the Advanced Gas-Cooled Reactors (AGR) into our group for decommissioning, thereby expanding our responsibilities and scope. Our role in new nuclear initiatives remains important, highlighting our part in supporting the UK's energy security and sustainability goals.

Outreach activities

David Peattie, NDA Group CEO, Clive Nixon, Group Chief Nuclear Strategy Officer, and Holly Cresswell, International Relations Manager, represented the NDA at the recent UK-France Civil Nuclear Seminar. The event brought together senior figures to explore future collaboration between the UK and France in civil nuclear with panel sessions considering:

- Building a Workforce for the Future
- Ensuring a Responsible Nuclear Legacy
- Preparing for European Ambitions: Advanced Modular Reactors and Research

A key discussion point included the critical role of international collaboration in delivering our mission, particularly in tackling shared challenges in decommissioning, dismantling, and waste management. Whilst a key takeaway was the value of our partnerships—especially the knowledge exchange through Nuclear Waste Services (NWS) on radioactive waste and geological disposal. These relationships help us



strengthen our technical capabilities and deliver more effectively for the UK public.

We also reaffirmed our long-standing cooperation with the French Alternative Energies and Atomic Energy Commission (CEA), agreeing to deepen collaboration on decommissioning and waste management—areas central to our work.

The nuclear industry has marked three significant anniversaries as His Majesty the King met with members of the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) group in Caithness Scotland, during his annual visit to the region. The visit recognised the NDA group's progress in its national mission to safely decommission the UK's earliest nuclear sites, and its long-standing contribution to sustainability and economic development in the region and across the UK.

The visit coincided with the NDA group marking several significant milestones including the 20th anniversary of the NDA and 70 years for NRS Dounreay, which has been an enduring presence at the heart of the Caithness community. This year also marks 50 years for Pacific Nuclear Transport Ltd (PNTL). Founded in 1975, PNTL is the world's leading maritime nuclear transporter and part of NDA subsidiary, Nuclear Transport Solutions (NTS). The King also viewed the Pacific Heron, part of the PNTL fleet of ships designed to safely transport nuclear materials around the globe.

Engagement priorities for 2025

As you are aware, the consultation on the NDA draft **Strategy 5** was launched on 7 August and closed on 29 September. Our strategy document is published every 5 years and describes our high-level approach to delivering our mission. Within that, we identify several critical enablers essential to the successful delivery of our mission including public and stakeholder engagement. Once this has concluded and we analyse comments the final document will be produced and published in March 2026.

This year's Stakeholder Summit will be held virtually on 3 November. Marking the NDA's 20th anniversary, the summit will involve sharing important strategic updates as we continue to strengthen our engagement with stakeholders.

Publications, public service and policy updates

The NDA Annual Report and Accounts 2024/25 sets out the progress we're making against our mission, from safely decommissioning existing sites to preparing to take responsibility for more, while managing radioactive waste for our existing programme and new nuclear.

As we mark our 20th anniversary, this year's report reflects a strong year of delivery across the NDA group with continued progress on our mission: safely decommissioning our sites, managing radioactive waste, and preparing to take on new responsibilities.



Key highlights from the last 12 months include:

- Sellafield is now removing waste from all four legacy ponds and silos – a major milestone in hazard reduction.
- Nuclear Waste Services is progressing with final capping at the LLW Repository.
- Visible skyline changes across the estate, including the demolition of Sizewell A's turbine hall.
- Ongoing work to identify a suitable site and community for a Geological Disposal Facility.
- Innovation in action: sail trials for NTS ships and autonomous security systems at Winfrith.
- Preparations continue for the transfer of the AGR fleet and potential decommissioning of the Vulcan site.

Additionally, we've seen improvements in safety, environmental performance, and cyber security, supported by the opening of a new cyber facility to boost collaboration.

2024/25 also saw another year of significant investment in our people and communities. We had a record early careers intake in 2025 with over 420 apprentices and 300 graduates. As well as that, we saw continued support for skills, schools, and supply chain development – part of our £49m annual investment. And finally, we saw the continued ongoing delivery of our Inclusion Strategy, with real progress on equality, diversity, and inclusion.

The NDA group has also secured £154million in government funding to develop pioneering technology for the safe disposal of UK's civil plutonium inventory. This investment over five years will support around 100 jobs and enable the design, installation and operation of specialist labs at Sellafield to test and improve immobilisation technologies.

Two approaches are being explored: Disposal MOX (DMOX), which produces ceramic pellets, and Hot Isostatic Pressing (HIP), which creates a rock-like ceramic form. Once immobilised, the material will be prepared for final disposal in a Geological Disposal Facility (GDF), with Nuclear Waste Services (NWS) leading on waste form suitability.

A £2.5 million contribution is also being made to a new £5 million Plutonium Ceramics Academic Hub, in partnership with the Universities of Manchester and Sheffield, to build technical expertise and support future capability.

2. Routine matters

2.1. Inspections

Inspections are undertaken as part of the process for monitoring compliance with:

- The conditions attached by ONR to the nuclear site licence granted under the Nuclear Installations Act 1965 (NIA65) (as amended);
- The Energy Act 2013;
- The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 (HSWA74); and
- Regulations made under HSWA74, for example, the Ionising Radiations Regulations 2017 (IRR17) and the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (MHSWR99).

The inspections entail monitoring the licensee's actions on the site in relation to incidents, operations, maintenance, projects, modifications, safety case changes and any other matters that may affect safety. The licensee is required to make and implement adequate arrangements under the conditions attached to the licence in order to ensure legal compliance. Inspections seek to judge both the adequacy of these arrangements and their implementation.

In this period, routine inspections of Wylfa covered the following:

- examination, maintenance, inspection and testing

Licensees are required to have arrangements to respond to non-routine matters and events. Our inspectors judge the adequacy of the licensee's response, including actions taken to implement any necessary improvements.

4. Regulatory activity

We may issue formal documents to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. Under nuclear site licence conditions, we issue regulatory documents, which either permit an activity or require some form of action to be taken. These are usually collectively termed licence instruments but can take other forms. In addition, inspectors may take a range of enforcement actions, to include issuing an enforcement notice.

- No licence instruments, enforcement notices or enforcement letters were issued during this period.

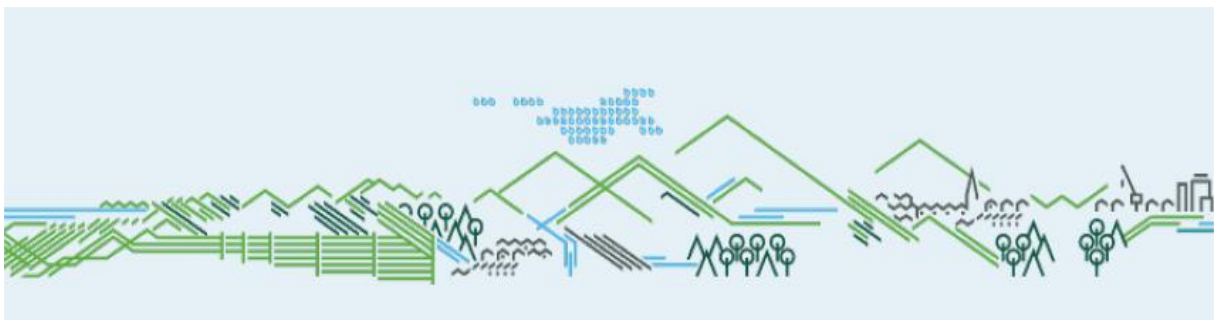

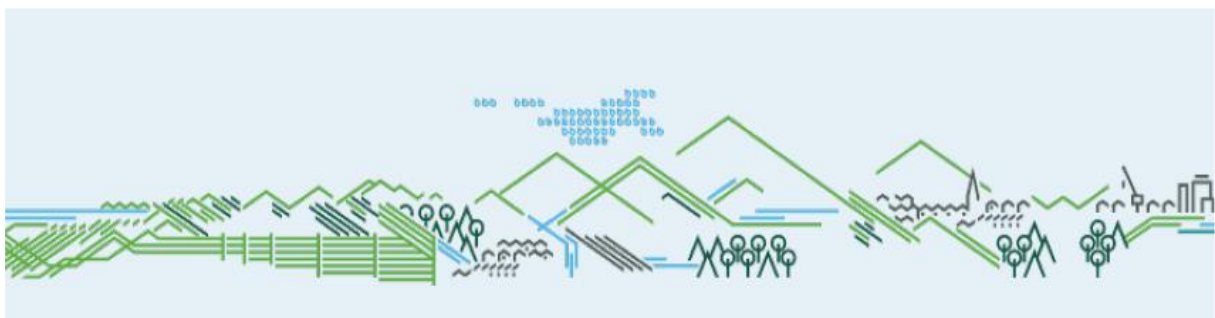

FOREWORD

This report is issued to the Site Stakeholder Group (SSG) to provide a summary of the regulatory activities of Natural Resources Wales (NRW) relating to the Wylfa nuclear site.

NRW is accountable to the Welsh Government for the environmental regulation of nuclear sites in Wales. NRW has a contractual arrangement in place which enables them to draw on the experience and resources of the Environment Agency's specialist Nuclear Regulation Group, to assist in the delivery of on-site inspection work and associated assessments.

We regulate the disposal of radioactive waste, operation of combustion plant, discharges to water and conventional waste. Please see Annex 1 for further information on our role.



Introduction

This report covers the period from April to September 2025

Inspections

There were no inspections during this reporting period.

Discharges

Radioactive discharges to air and water from Wylfa were within permitted limits in this reporting period. Non-radioactive discharges to water were also within permitted limits.

In July NRS confirmed they were implementing their plan to allow the reactor buildings to breath naturally. To date this has not affected permitted limits.

Environmental monitoring

During this reporting period we received Annual Retrospective Dose Assessment data for 2024 from site - there were no unusual results.

Permitting

There were no changes to the radioactive substances activity environmental permit during this reporting period.

Events and enforcement

We regularly review summaries of all events reported and discuss those relevant to environmental compliance with NRS Ltd. as part of our routine regulation.

There were no events of note in this reporting period.

The role of Natural Resources Wales and the Environment Agency at nuclear sites

Operating and cleaning up nuclear sites generates radioactive and non-radioactive wastes. Our role as the environmental regulator is to ensure that the impact of those wastes on people and the environment, now and in the future, is as small as it can be. We also aim to prevent pollution, enhance the environment, and contribute to the sustainable development of the UK.

We inspect nuclear sites and assess proposals from operators, to provide assurance that the operator is complying with the limits and conditions of the permits we issue under the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2016 (as amended) and other relevant legislation and policy.

We supplement direct regulation with a partnership approach, working with the operators, the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) and the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) to solve problems jointly.

We expect operators to comply fully with all relevant legislative requirements and permits. If this does not happen, we will not hesitate to use our enforcement powers to ensure that action is taken to protect the environment or to secure compliance.

In summary our objectives are to:

- Ensure that environmental permits are up to date, flexible and fit for purpose and that they drive environmental improvement
- Assess compliance with the limits and conditions of the permits
- Reduce risks to the environment and avoid creating further legacies
- Ensure that integrated waste strategies continue to improve
- Ensure that solid waste is packaged in a form suitable for disposal
- Ensure that infrastructure and assets are maintained to minimise environmental impact
- Develop guidance on Best Available Techniques (BAT)
- Influence NDA so that they provide appropriate direction to operators to minimise waste and improve environmental outcomes
- Encourage integrated management of fuel and nuclear materials so as to prevent or minimise the potential environmental impacts
- Ensure land and groundwater contaminated by radioactivity or other pollutants is managed appropriately and protect land and groundwater from further contamination
- Monitor and assess organisational change to ensure that environmental performance is maintained
