Sioe Môn - llwyddwyd i sicrhau llain yn y sioe i hyrwyddo cyfleoedd a datblygiad gyrfaal.

Materion economaidd-gymdeithasol NRS

- Mae cyllido economaidd-gymdeithasol NRS yn dal yn £1.1m yn flynyddol ar draws y deuddeg safle, gyda £6,000 fesul safle am lefel cymydog da.
- £1.02m wedi'i ymrwymo hyd yma, ac mae £132,000 ohono'n cefnogi prosiectau yng nghymunedau Wylfa.
- £360,000 o gyllid ychwanegol gan yr NDA – £300,000 o gymorth parhaus i Brosiect Ymchwil Cymeriad Morol Morlais a £60,000 ar gyfer Tîm Carbon Isel MSParc (Mawrth-Awst 2024)

Derbyniodd **Cyngor Tref Caergybi** £1,000 i brynu gasibo cynaliadwy gyda brand NRS arno. Mae gwirfoddolwyr o gefndiroedd amrywiol yn croesawu twristiaid o'r llongau pleser i Borthladd Caergybi. Croesawyd 24,000 o deithwyr mordaith yn 2023, a disgwyliar mwy eleni.

Derbyniodd **Cyngor Cymuned Rhosybol** £1000 tuag at ddigwyddiad Cofio D-Day i goffáu 80 mlynedd. Fe'i cynhaliwyd ar Fynydd Parys a daeth nifer dda i'r digwyddiad.

Gwahoddodd y Cadeirydd yr aelodau i gyflwyno unrhyw gwestiynau.

Sesiwn Holi ac Ateb

Holodd y **Cyng GP** a oedd unrhyw fylchau yn y gweithlu oherwydd diffyg cyllid neu ddiffyg sgiliau. Dywedodd SL fod hyn yn dibynnu ar y swydd dan sylw. Er enghraifft, mae tynnu asbestos yn gofyn am sgiliau penodol ac mae gofyn am gyllid ychwanegol. Dywedodd hefyd, fodd bynnag, y gall cydweithio â safle Trawsfynydd arwain at rannu sgiliau a chostau.

1 Welcome and Receive Apologies for Absence

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting and noted the absences as recorded above.

He gave a particular welcome to Cllr Gary Pritchard as the new Leader for Isle of Anglesey Council. Cllr Pritchard thanked the Chair and Site Director for the site visit preceding this meeting. The Chair also thanked Stuart Law and Elin P Jones for arranging the visit.

AMJ wished David Wilby the previous NRW representative well in his new post with the Environment Agency.

The Chair also welcomed Llinos Medi to the meeting in her role as the newly elected Plaid Cymru MP for Ynys Môn.

2. Approval of Minutes of the Meeting held 11.04.24.

4 SSG Chairman's Report

The Chair gave a brief update on the following:

- SSG Chairs/ Local Authority Meeting 8-9 July
- NDA Stakeholder Summit in Manchester 17-18 September

5 Wylfa Site Director's Report

SL presented the Site update report summarised as follows: -

The **10 year Strategy** outlining the future opportunities for all NRS sites has been launched with Trawsfynydd identified as the Lead and Learn site. The presentation referred to the Wylfa specific milestones for 2024/2025.

EHSS&Q statistics

SL reported on the safety statistics as follows:-

- Total recorded incident rate (TRIR): 0.00
- Days away case rate (DACR) 0.00
- Number of days since a lost time accident: 2311 days (as at 8 October 2024)

People

Wylfa One Team

- 195 NRS site staff
- 76 NRS based at the Wylfa Hub.
- Staff have recently completed the Annual Staff Survey

Apprentices

SL noted that the apprentice intake for September has been completed. Three apprentices have secured ongoing permanent employment on site.

A 4 year Strategic Workforce Plan is currently being developed.

Decommissioning programme

- A new and independent Electrical Overlay System is required that will meet modern standards, as well as being more appropriate for a deferral site. SL stated that the detail design had commenced and that preparations are underway to clear cable trays and the redundant switchboard. A new Earthing Design has been completed and awaiting report to be issued.
- On-Site Distribution Enabling Scope - Permanent Disconnection: All 18 tagged systems in tunnel 2RG1-4 have been disconnected from their switchboards. The remaining three systems will be de-cabled by the end of October. Cable Removal: About 14,000kg of cables have been removed and recycled.
- New supply to site - Legal easement and deed have been completed. The schedule for installing new ductwork along the approach road is being advanced.
- Reactor asbestos removal - this project supports the company strategy for reducing the asbestos hazard prior to entry into the deferral period.
- Turbine Hall (TH) Islanding – this project is to isolate the Turbine Hall and will include air gapping of services (both mechanically and electrically) into and out of the TH including the Ancillary Buildings within the proposed PC boundary area, which will then become the construction site.
- Dry Store Cell 4 skip removal, a first-of-its-kind project at Wylfa, aims to remediate legacy issues in the storage cell. A commercial strategy has been developed taking on board the new Public Procurement Regulations. The team is now focused on removing the East end charge chute onto the pile cap and has made steady progress with enabling activities.

Waste programme

- HAW/LAW processing facility - currently, there is no suitable location for the processing and packing of Higher and Lower Active Wastes (HAW/LAW) on site.
- ILW retrieval project – finished Phase 2 of the optioneering workshop.
- Waste Clearance facility – the Beyond Design Basis building ready for dismantling. Following the PAC a full planning application has been presented to the Local Authority.
- DCIC storage facility – Interim Storage Facility. An updated implementation schedule has been created, simplifying the commercial process.

Areas for Improvement

- High Legionella results – an enhanced flushing regime is in place and under constant review. SL noted that there are no immediate health issues on site.
- Plant degradation and equipment failures – degeneration and corrosion of some structures have been identified with a repair or removal prioritisation plan in place.
- ONR Enforcement notice – improvement for some systems required.

Good Practice

- Wildlife Trust's 30 Days Wild campaign was supported by the Site throughout June.

- Environmental Sampling Adjustments - the Environmental Sampling Team conducted all sampling at Wylfa Head on foot instead of using 4x4 vehicles. This change aims to minimize potential damage to the important ecological areas.
- Radiological Protection - the frequency of sampling seaweed in a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) was reduced. This adjustment helps to minimize damage and safeguard this sparse variety of seaweed.
- Beach clean - volunteers from Wylfa participated in a beach clean-up at Aberffraw beach on September 3rd.
- Environmental Awareness Display - a display outside the canteen featured a petition urging water companies to improve their sewage systems.
- Carbon footprint workshop - the session included an interactive component where participants calculated their own carbon footprints and discussed the results thus highlighting the importance of awareness in reducing carbon emissions.
- Compostable Waste Stream - has been added to each mess room. This initiative aims to reduce food waste sent to landfill, promoting more sustainable waste management practices.

STEM

SL reported that school visits to the Site have continued in collaboration with the Trawsfynydd site. The Engineering Manager and STEM lead has highlighted the importance of these visits in promoting the industry and helping young people make informed career choices.

Tyddyn Môn – the Wylfa Waste Projects team and Sites Executive Team volunteered at Tyddyn Môn, a local charity supporting adults with learning disabilities. Organised through the NRS Volunteering Programme and Neighbourly, the teams focused on re-sheeting a polytunnel for winter and enhancing a sensory music outdoor space.

Anglesey Show - secured a pitch during the show to promote career opportunities and development.

NRS Socio economic

- NRS socio-economic funding remains at £1.1m annually across the twelve sites, with £6,000 per site for good neighbour level.
- £1.02m committed to date, £132,000 of which is supporting projects in Wylfa's communities.
- An additional £360,000 NDA funding - £300,000 for continued support for the Morlais Marine Characterisation Research Project and £60,000 for MSParc Low Carbon Team (March-August 2024)

Holyhead Town Council received £1,000 to purchase NRS branded sustainable gazebos. Volunteers of diverse backgrounds welcome tourists from the cruise ships into Holyhead Port. 24,000 cruise passengers were welcomed in 2023, with more expected this year.

Rhosybol Community Council - received £1000 towards a Remembrance D-Day event commemorating the 80th Anniversary and held on Mynydd Parys and was very well attended.

The Chair invited members to present any questions.

Question and Answer Session

Cllr GP enquired as to whether any gaps in workforce were due to lack of funding or lack of skills. SL stated that this was dependent on the job in hand. For example, the removal of asbestos requires specific skills requiring additional funding. He also stated, however, that collaborative working with the Trawsfynydd site can result in sharing of skills and costs.

Cllr.GW enquired as to the total number of apprentices currently on site. SL confirmed that there are currently 4 which is fewer than previous years. He also noted, however, that the staff numbers are reduced which results in the reduction of work programmes and mentor support.

Cllr. DO – enquired about electricity supply backup. SL noted that the whole of Anglesey is supported by one transformer at this time and that his priority was to ensure security in situations of restrictions in supply.

The Chair thanked SL for his presentation and also thanked the Socio-Economic funding of the Commemorative event on Mynydd Parys which was a resounding success. He hoped for continued support from the NRS in another future commemorative event to be scheduled in 2025.

Llinos Medi MP thanked SL and his staff for ensuring the high standard of safety on the site for all.

6 NRS Corporate update

Mr Bill Hamilton had tendered his apologies, the 'Thinks Insight' presentation will be delivered at the next SSG meeting.

7. Nuclear Decommissioning Authority

David Wallace was welcomed to the meeting and summarised the report shared with the meeting papers as follows:

He introduced Alistair Findlay NDA Head of Regional Affairs to the group. Mr Findlay was appointed on 8.9.24.

- **General Election** – noted a change in Government with Labour Party now in power. DW also welcomed the new MP for Ynys Môn, Llinos Medi.
- **Engagement priorities for 2024**
 - A Stakeholder Conference was held on 17 and 18 of September in Manchester. Videos from the event will be available on the NDA webpage. It was announced that the NDA would be investing an extra £5m over the next five years to support

around 20 PhDs. This builds on the current annual spend of £45m in early careers, including apprenticeships, graduates, and PhDs.

- Cross Party working group is being established in Wales, working with the NIA, and reflecting the group already established in Scotland. It is envisaged that the first meeting will take place in November 2024 in the Senedd.
- Spending Review – the review result is yet to be received.
- A Cyber Security centre has been developed to identify and address any security breaches.
- Members were encouraged to view the links within the report for further details of developments.

Question and Answer session. – none received

The Chair thanked DW for his presentation.

8 Office for Nuclear Regulation Update

Tanya MacLeod had tendered her apologies. Members acknowledged receipt and content of her report previously circulated within the meeting papers pack.

Question and Answer session - none presented.

9 Natural Resources Wales / Environmental Agency Update

A joint NRW/EA report for the period April 2024 – September 2024 was presented by Iwan Williams.

IW informed members that David Wilby has moved to a new post with the Environment Agency, he was wished well by all.

IW had no further information to share other than the content of the report and that positive collaborative working with the Site continues.

Question and Answer session.

Cllr GOJ referred to the recent announcement that National Resources Wales will be reducing their workforce and queried how this will affect future work. IW noted that these were undoubtedly challenging times but that there will be no reduction in the regulatory elements of the business.

**NDA Stakeholder Update**

Please find below a brief update on main points of interest since the last meeting.

Government Update

Following the reestablishment of Parliament in the Autumn the running of government the selection of representation for select committees has concluded alongside familiarisation visits for key Ministers and officials into their appointment areas.

Key appointments include local Sellafield MP Josh MacAlister, as Chair of the All Party Parliamentary Group for Nuclear with David Mundell, MP for the area covering Chapelcross, as Vice Chair. The Energy and Net Zero Committee (ESNZ) has also made appointments which include site MPs Josh MacAlister and Julie Minns and there are three MPs with NDA sites located in their constituencies sitting in the Public Accounts (PAC) and ESNZ.

David Peattie, along with Corhyn Parr and Euan Hutton, appeared before the ESNZ committee on the 18th December and answered questions on a wide variety of subjects connected to the NDAs mission. If you've not had a chance to watch the proceedings, the hearing is available to view online [here](#).

It has recently been announced that Seth Kybird will succeed Corhyn Parr as CEO of Nuclear Waste Services (NWS) following Corhyn's announcement last year of her intention to stand down. Seth is joining NWS on an 18-month secondment from Nuclear Transport Services (NTS), where he was CEO.

Spending Review

Jonathan Jenkin will give a verbal update on the Spending Review and NDA settlement.

Outreach activities

- On the 15th and 16th January, the UK decommissioning sector came together in Telford. On the 15th DECOM 25 took place with delegates from across the decommissioning sector discussing a whole range of topics, including the development of the UK sites and the opportunities for the supply chain, the skills needed to succeed, decommissioning in other sectors and the challenges of preparing for the future of decommissioning. On the 16th there was an NDA supply chain event, providing 1700 delegates the opportunity to connect with 300 exhibiting companies.



- On 5th March, we published our latest **stakeholder survey**. The findings will help shape our future strategy and plans.
- The latest **Cross Party Group (CPG)** took place in the **Scottish Parliament** with the main topic being 'Radioactive Waste - dealing with the legacy'. Topics including how waste was generated, how it is dealt with in Scotland, movement of waste located in Scotland and non-energy sources of radioactive waste. There were around 40 attendees both in person and via Teams.

Engagement priorities for 2025

- The NDA celebrates its 20th anniversary this year, and we are planning some events around this. We would like to mark an SSG meeting at each site with a special presentation reviewing the progress over the last 20 years – more details to follow.
- Our review into the SSGs is nearing its conclusion, following an update to the NDA Guidance to the SSGs, discussions with the Chair and Deputy Chair of the National SSG Forum and a meeting with all SSG Chairs and Deputy Chairs. There are four main areas of recommendations on how to improve accountability, modernise and provide support to SSGs. This exercise will provide an opportunity to reflect on the successes of the stakeholder voice in the local community over the last 20 years. It will also allow us to consider how best to address some of the challenges that face us as we think about the future.
- Nuclear week in Parliament took place from the 27th January with the NDA and NDA group Operating Companies hosting events
- As you will be aware, preparation is underway for **Strategy V** which we expect to publish in March 2026. Our strategy document is published every 5 years and describes our high-level approach to delivering our mission. Within that, we identify several critical enablers essential to the successful delivery of our mission including public and stakeholder engagement. The strategy will go out to consultation in May 2025.
- We are working closely with the Nuclear Industries Association (NIA) to establish a **Cross-Party Group on the Civil Nuclear Industry in the Welsh Parliament**. The first meeting took place on the 21st January.

Publications, public service and policy updates

- On 10th April, we published our Draft Business Plan covering the years 2025 – 2028 for a six-week consultation period, closing on 22nd April. The Draft



Business Plan reflects our most recent Strategy, published in 2021, and sets out key activities and the progress expected across our sites during the next three years, in line with funding allocated by the Department of Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ). The consultation will run in accordance with the criteria set out in the [Cabinet Office's Consultation principles guidelines](#).

- We have now published our **Annual Report** which has also been laid in Parliament. The Annual Report sets out the progress made against our mission, from safely decommissioning existing sites to preparing to take responsibility for more, while managing radioactive waste for our existing programme and new nuclear
- As previously advised, we expect the Scottish Government to start its review into its policy for higher activity radioactive waste (HAW). The policy framework is set out in a 2011 Policy and the 2016 Implementation Strategy. The anticipated timeline is: Commence review – late 2024, hold a public consultation – early 2025, issue a revised Policy document – late 2025.



- The **NAO value for money study** into whether Sellafield and the NDA are taking a sustainable approach to decommissioning, leading to permanent hazard reduction has now been published and can be found via the following link [Decommissioning Sellafield: managing risks from the nuclear legacy - NAO report](#). The Public Accounts Committee will visit Sellafield in February with a hearing taking place later this Spring.
- We have recently published our [Nuclear Heritage Strategy](#), which enables the NDA Group to identify and preserve the tangible and intangible assets, objects, and memories of the nuclear industry, the people who worked in it, and the communities that supported it.
- Our **Socio Economic Report for 2023/24** is now published, detailing a record investment in projects across the UK - [NDA group investing in our communities - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](#)
- Following the publication of the Chapelcross masterplan in August 2024 the NDA has been leading work to identify a strategic partner for the development that will deliver the vision for the sites transformation into a green energy hub. We are now evaluating the proposals from potential partners and hope to be able to make an announcement this Spring.
- The NDA has funded a [project](#) in North Wales, which has delivered a range of successful outcomes for the low-carbon sector across North Wales. M-SParc's Egni team, based on Anglesey, has worked with a range of partners throughout the three-year programme to deliver impactful projects that support businesses, drive investment and educate the next generation. The Egni team was created in 2021 with a £360,000 grant from the NDA's Socio-Economic Fund. The team is now permanently established – with four full-time team members, four associate members and two interns – and will continue to meet the needs of the low-carbon sector as it develops in the future.

Mission delivery

- The NDA Group welcomes the government's decision to immobilise the UK's inventory of civil separated plutonium at Sellafield. Immobilisation will put the material beyond reach, further mitigating the long-term safety and security risks associated with it. We will continue to progress research and development work to identify the preferred technology for immobilisation, converting the material to an even safer and more safer form ready for final disposal in a Geological Disposal Facility (GDF).
- We are also funding a £5m Plutonium Ceramics Academic Hub at the Universities of Manchester and Sheffield. Over the next five years, the Hub will



fund around 20 PhD students and two post-doctoral researchers, equipping them with the expertise to develop solutions and inform critical decisions on the safe management, storage and disposal of one of the world's largest civilian inventories of separated plutonium.

- The NDA recently launched its brand-new, specialised cyber facility to accelerate collaboration and innovation across nuclear operators and the supply chain, enhancing the collective ability to successfully defend against cyber threats. The Group Cyberspace Collaboration Centre (GCCC) provides a space for experts in cyber, digital and security to come together and share knowledge and learning on how best to defend against evolving threats. The centre is a multi-functional space for collaborating, brainstorming, workshops, talks, learning and tutorials, cyber exercising, incident management and more. It aims to encourage our cyber, digital and security experts to think and work differently, with our shared future foremost in mind.
- Future plans for our Chapelcross site in Dumfries and Galloway were unveiled in August, with a long-term vision to develop the site into a Green Energy Hub: [Chapelcross Masterplan - CX Project](#)
- NWS and the NDA have established an innovative partnership for the enhanced management of asbestos waste, awarding two contracts to establish the **Asbestos Innovation Partnership**. This partnership will work with the NDA group and the supply chain, to test and develop new solutions to treat asbestos waste, helping to deliver efficiencies and enable more effective waste management.
- A collaboration between NRS, NTS and NWS has achieved a significant milestone by transporting the final waste from the Treated Radwaste Store (TRS) in Winfrith to the LLWR for disposal. The completion of this project ahead of schedule means that the need for **waste storage at Winfrith** which closed in 1990 has been removed, leaving the site ready for decommissioning.
- NDA and NRS have underlined their commitment to Government to, where possible, safely accelerate **land release at Harwell** site to maximise the economic impact of decommissioning. We have identified clear areas of strategic importance and will work together with the Harwell Campus joint venture on developing options for those areas. We are at early stages and still progressing the current release of plots, aiming to have a broader plan for land release this autumn.

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1. Inspections

1.1. Date(s) of inspection

The ONR site inspector made inspections on the following dates during the report period 1 July – 31 December 2024:

- 30 – 31st July
- 10th – 11th September
- 18th – 19th September

2. Routine matters

2.1. Inspections

Inspections are undertaken as part of the process for monitoring compliance with:

- the conditions attached by ONR to the nuclear site licence granted under the Nuclear Installations Act 1965 (NIA65) (as amended);
- the Energy Act 2013
- the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 (HSWA74); and
- regulations made under HSWA74, for example the Ionising Radiations Regulations 2017 (IRR17) and the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (MHSWR99).

The inspections entail monitoring the licensee's actions on the site in relation to incidents, operations, maintenance, projects, modifications, safety case changes and any other matters that may affect safety. The licensee is required to make and implement adequate arrangements under the conditions attached to the licence in order to ensure legal compliance. Inspections seek to judge both the adequacy of these arrangements and their implementation.

In this period, routine inspections of Wylfa covered the following:

- radioactive waste management;
- decommissioning;
- security

3. Non-routine matters

Licensees are required to have arrangements to respond to non-routine matters and events. ONR inspectors judge the adequacy of the licensee's response, including actions taken to implement any necessary improvements.

There were no such matters or events of significance during the period.

4. Regulatory activity

ONR may issue formal documents to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. Under nuclear site licence conditions, ONR issues regulatory documents, which either permit an activity or require some form of action to be taken; these are usually collectively termed 'Licence Instruments' (LIs) but can take other forms. In addition, inspectors may take a range of enforcement actions, to include issuing an Enforcement Notice.

- One enforcement letter was issued during the period relating cyber security.

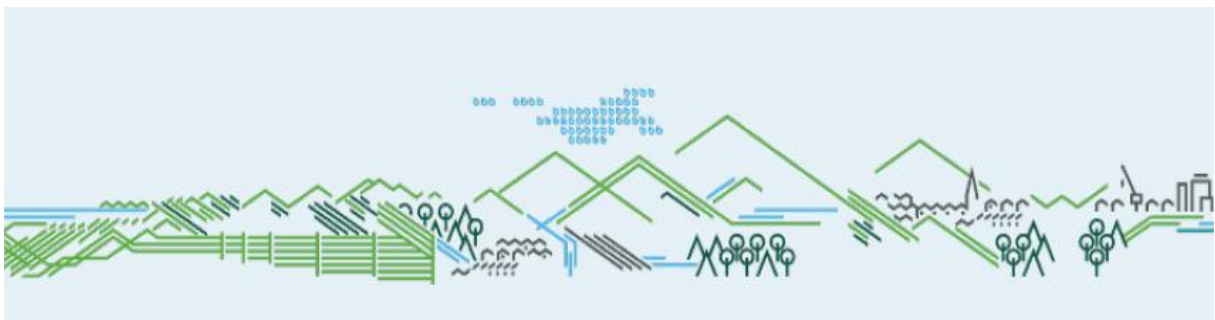

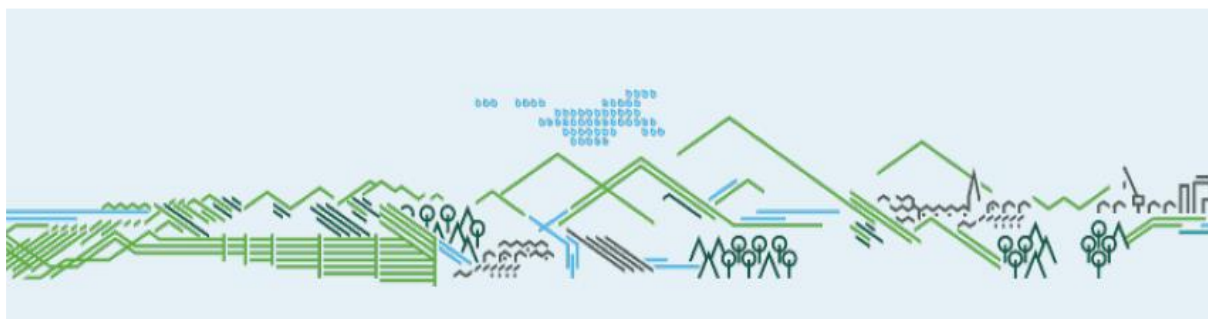

FOREWORD

This report is issued to the Site Stakeholder Group (SSG) to provide a summary of the regulatory activities of Natural Resources Wales (NRW) relating to the Wylfa nuclear site.

NRW is accountable to the Welsh Government for the environmental regulation of nuclear sites in Wales. NRW has a contractual arrangement in place which enables them to draw on the experience and resources of the Environment Agency's specialist Nuclear Regulation Group, to assist in the delivery of on-site inspection work and associated assessments.

We regulate the disposal of radioactive waste, operation of combustion plant, discharges to water and conventional waste. Please see Annex 1 for further information on our role.



Introduction

This report covers the period from September 2024 to March 2025

Inspections

We are planning to conduct an inspection on asset management on 27th March. We will provide a summary of our findings at the April meeting.

Discharges

Radioactive discharges to air and water from the Wylfa site were within permitted limits in this reporting period. Non-radioactive discharges to water were also within permitted limits.

Environmental monitoring

We received the environmental monitoring programme results as required by the EPR-RSA permit. During this reporting period there were no unusual results.

Permitting

We received a request from NRS in November 2024 to change the Compilation of Environment Agencies Requirements, Approvals and Specifications (CEAR). The changes include:

- Changes to liquid effluent sampling and analysis requirements, as requested and agreed with NRS at a fleet level.
- Addition of a new approved outlet to air requested by NRS at Wylfa. To include the heavy engineering store as an additional gaseous disposal outlet (as an approved outlet) in case an abnormal event occurred and resulted in a release to air which could be indicated by general area radiological air monitoring.

An updated CEAR was issued to NRS in February 2025.

Events and enforcement

We regularly review summaries of all events reported and discuss those relevant to environmental compliance with NRS Ltd. as part of our routine regulation.

In August 2024 NRS Ltd. told us about an issue they had discovered in their monitoring of discharges from Dry Store Cell 5. NRS investigated the issue and provided us with a report in October. We reviewed the report and concluded that sampling equipment had been incorrectly fitted to a pipe, resulting in a 6-week gap in sampling data. The error was corrected as soon as it was noticed.

We completed a compliance report in February 2025, which recorded two non-compliances against the EPR-RSA permit:

- A Category 3 (minor) non-compliance was recorded against condition 1.1.1(a).
- A category 4 (no impact) non-compliance was recorded against condition 2.3.6 (a)

The role of Natural Resources Wales and the Environment Agency at nuclear sites

Operating and cleaning up nuclear sites generates radioactive and non-radioactive wastes. Our role as the environmental regulator is to ensure that the impact of those wastes on people and the environment, now and in the future, is as small as it can be. We also aim to prevent pollution, enhance the environment, and contribute to the sustainable development of the UK.

We inspect nuclear sites and assess proposals from operators, to provide assurance that the operator is complying with the limits and conditions of the permits we issue under the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2016 (as amended) and other relevant legislation and policy.

We supplement direct regulation with a partnership approach, working with the operators, the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) and the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) to solve problems jointly.

We expect operators to comply fully with all relevant legislative requirements and permits. If this does not happen, we will not hesitate to use our enforcement powers to ensure that action is taken to protect the environment or to secure compliance.

In summary our objectives are to:

- Ensure that environmental permits are up to date, flexible and fit for purpose and that they drive environmental improvement
- Assess compliance with the limits and conditions of the permits
- Reduce risks to the environment and avoid creating further legacies
- Ensure that integrated waste strategies continue to improve
- Ensure that solid waste is packaged in a form suitable for disposal
- Ensure that infrastructure and assets are maintained to minimise environmental impact
- Develop guidance on Best Available Techniques (BAT)
- Influence NDA so that they provide appropriate direction to operators to minimise waste and improve environmental outcomes
- Encourage integrated management of fuel and nuclear materials so as to prevent or minimise the potential environmental impacts
- Ensure land and groundwater contaminated by radioactivity or other pollutants is managed appropriately and protect land and groundwater from further contamination
- Monitor and assess organisational change to ensure that environmental performance is maintained
