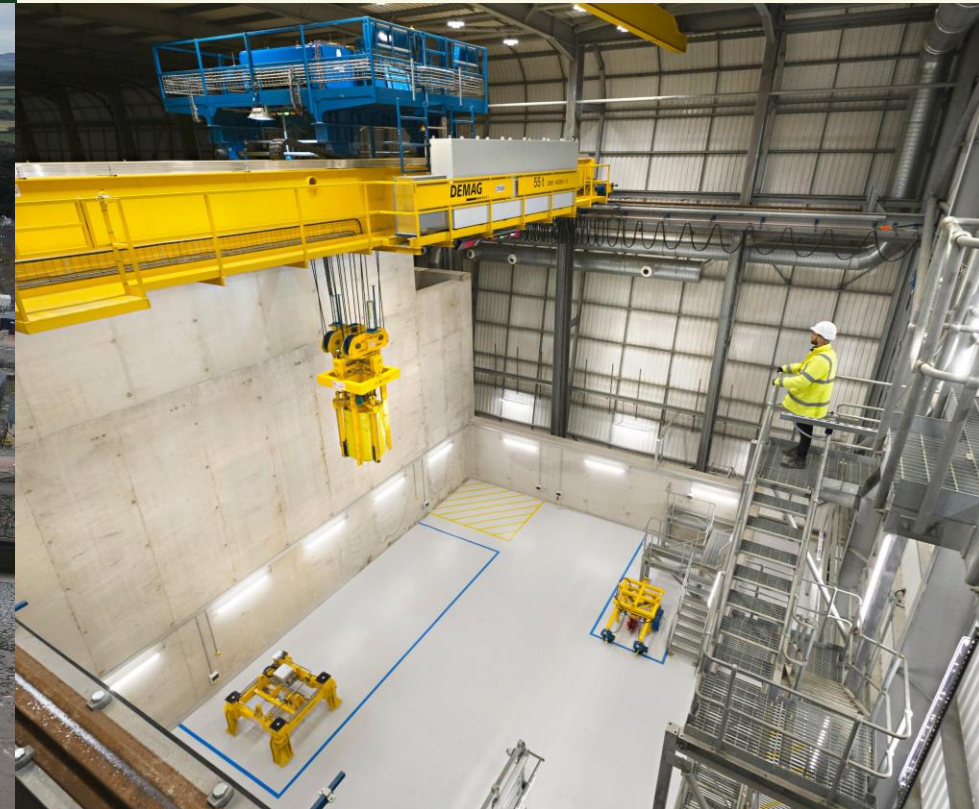

Successes & look ahead

Enduring Culture Programme

- High Performance Culture (HPC) Training now progressed to all leadership staff on site
- Safety Reps now embedded and a functioning HESAC has returned.

Hinkley School

- Apprentices for Dungeness and Harwell now run through our school.
- Training of Level 5 Health Physics Monitors for the fleet is now an option through our school.
- Tranche of Health Physics training completed for Hinkley and Berkeley cohort.



Compliance & deliver

- Boiler Houses Asbestos Remediation Project -project is now fully closed out.
- Fuel Element Debris retrieval target (3.2te) ahead of schedule currently at (5.9te)
- Dry Vault Retrieval Project enablers progressing.
- Planning application submitted for installation of new welfare facilities to support Waste Operations at west end of site.

- **Recruitment and Retention**

- 'Hinkley A School' continuing to invest in existing staff and local community to address local and national skills shortages
- Apprentice requirements for Sept 2025 currently being considered, 6 Nuclear Operatives, 1 Maintenance Technician at a minimum.
- Supporting national skills shortage, by training radiological protection technicians for other NRS Sites

- **Celebration**

- March 1965 (60 years) Hinkley Point A started generating from both reactors

- **Apprentices & STEM:**

- Hinkley supported Apprentice Week. Celebrating those passing out and talks with first year apprentices.
- Total number of apprentices now 14, with new levels of apprentices in position.

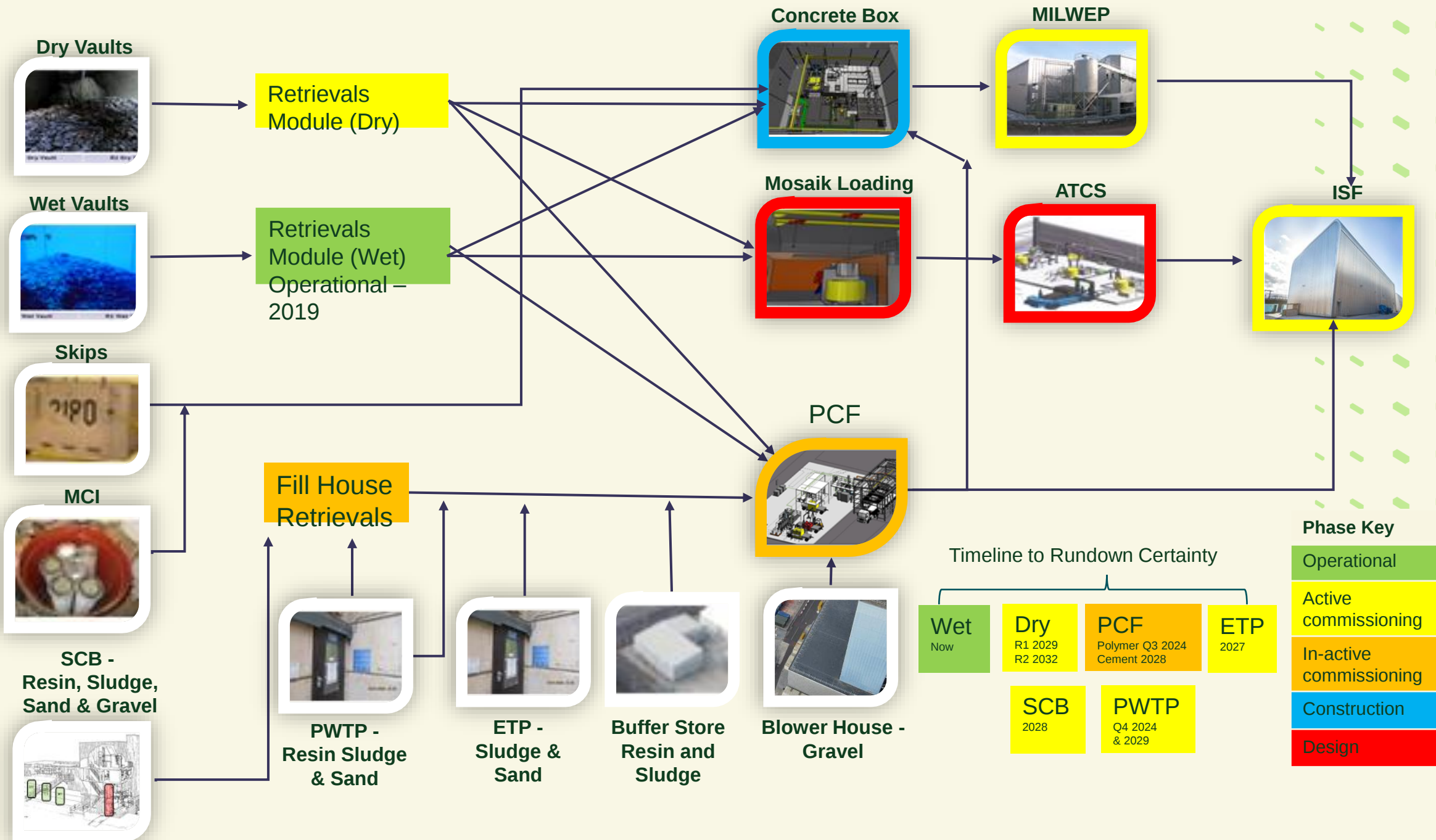

Hinkley A Intermediate Level Waste Journey



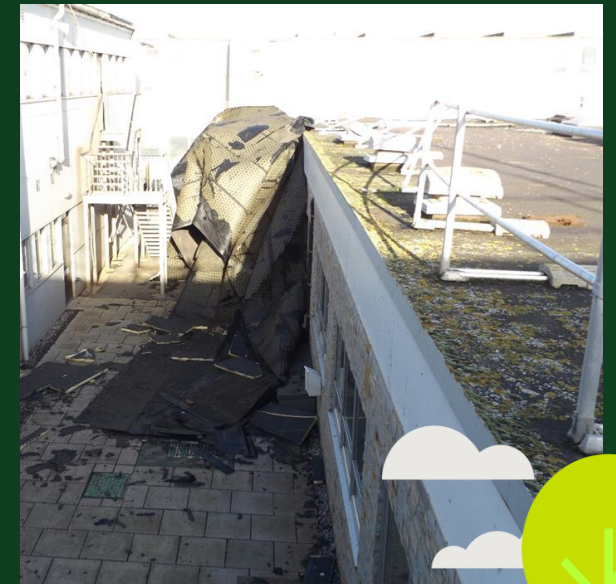
Spending Review

- NRS funding levels remain significant for 25/26.
- However, with rates of inflation and global market. instability increasing material and labour costs we cannot progress at the planned pace for 2026 -2029.
- Some projects around the fleet will be paused.
- Hinkley Point A doesn't have any major projects on the paused list.

- Repairs already underway.



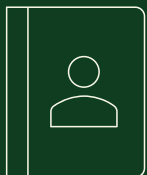

Good Neighbour (£6k per site)

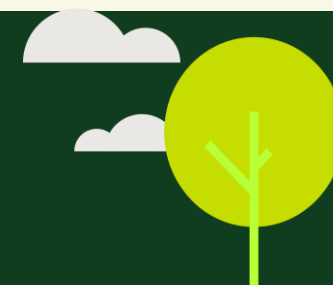
