SAFETY PERFORMANCE & OPERATIONS

There has been:

- **No recordable injuries**
- **No nuclear reportable incidents**
- **No environmental incidents**

11 June Sizewell B was automatically brought offline:-

- During switching operation - power supply interrupted
- No safety or compliance issues
- First automatic shutdown for over 3 years
- Reactor & TG2 returned to service 13 June followed by TG1 on 16 June



OUR PEOPLE

649 EDF staff this includes:-

- 23 Apprentices, 2 Industrial placements, 3 Technical Trainees, 1 Internship and 3 graduates
- 12 Visitor Centre staff

300 year round contracting partners

90 people working on the Relocated Facilities Projects

Long term operations programme:-

- EDF is fully committed to progressing the work to extend Sizewell B to 2055.
- Confident in technical case - seeking greater cost certainty and confidence in the long-term commercial case to make a final investment decision
- Increased our headcount by 10%



SIZEWELL B SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES FOURTH DRY FUEL STORE CAMPAIGN

- Safe transfer of 168 fuel assemblies from the fuel storage ponds into 7 x Holtec HI-STORM canisters into the Dry Fuel Store Building.
- The Dry Fuel Store provides a safe and robust solution for storing spent fuel until a permanent geological disposal facility becomes available.
- Campaign began in February completed end June without any nuclear safety events, environmental incidents, or lost time injuries.

REFUELLING OUTAGE UPDATE

- Sizewell B power station will be brought offline on **Friday 22 May 2026** - expected to last **45 days**
- **12,000** separate tasks
- Estimated **£107million** investment programme to include:-
 - Turbine Generator rotor replacement – 3 x low pressure and 1 x high pressure
 - Turbine control system replacement
 - Reactor Coolant Pump replacement
 - Thermal Sleeve inspection
 - Inspection of primary circuit pipework
 - Refuelling the reactor





STAFF RETURN TO THEIR ROOTS TO SUPPORT ALDE VALLEY ACADEMY GARDEN PROJECT

- Sizewell B staff rolled up their sleeves and headed back to their former school —Alde Valley Academy in Leiston.
- Supporting a transformative school garden project, using their Force for Good volunteering hours
- During the works the team planted a vibrant wildflower garden, completed a back breaking weeding of overgrown areas and painted fences and garden benches.
