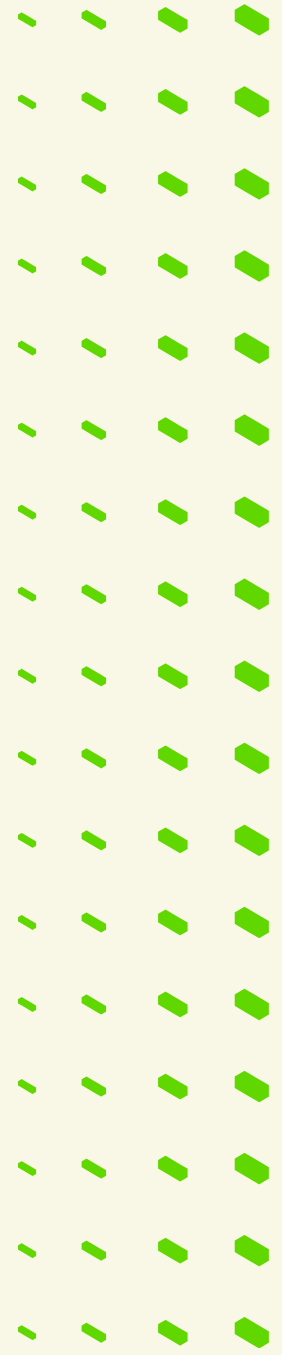

Metrics for Financial Year 2025/26

Joint Waste Management Plan Delivery (stretch) comprising:

- 3 x Metal Treatment consignments
(2 consigned to date)
- 3 x Incineration consignments
- 2 x VLLW consignments

Waste in stock awaiting approval to dispatch

Controlled Waste Dispatches:

- 1,973 Tonnes of controlled waste dispatched from site in FY 2025/26 (Turbine Hall and general site arising)



Waste Operations – Skip processing

Ponds Skip Processing Campaign:

- Inventory of 32 x redundant fuel skips loaded with size reduced ponds furniture during dive programme.

- 15 x empty LLW skips

- Waste being retrieved, processed, segregated and dispatched for treatment/disposal

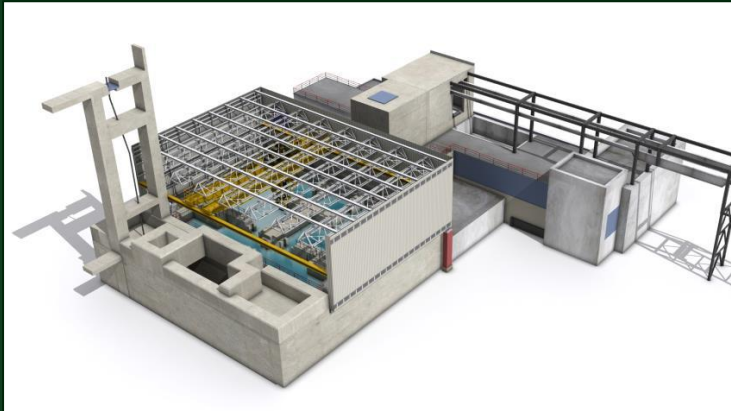
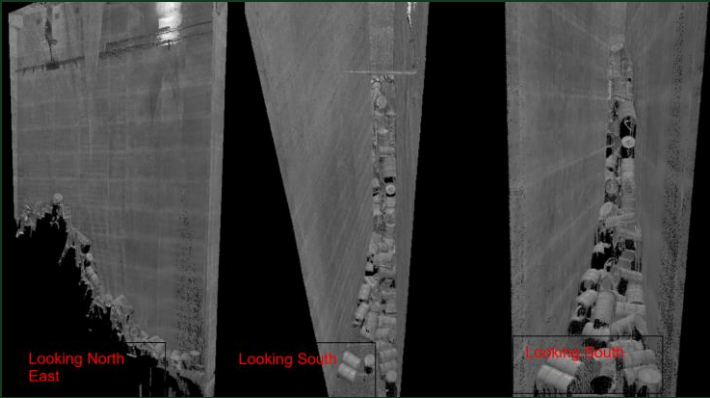
- Empty skips to be size reduced for disposal.

10781kg waste processed to date (61%)

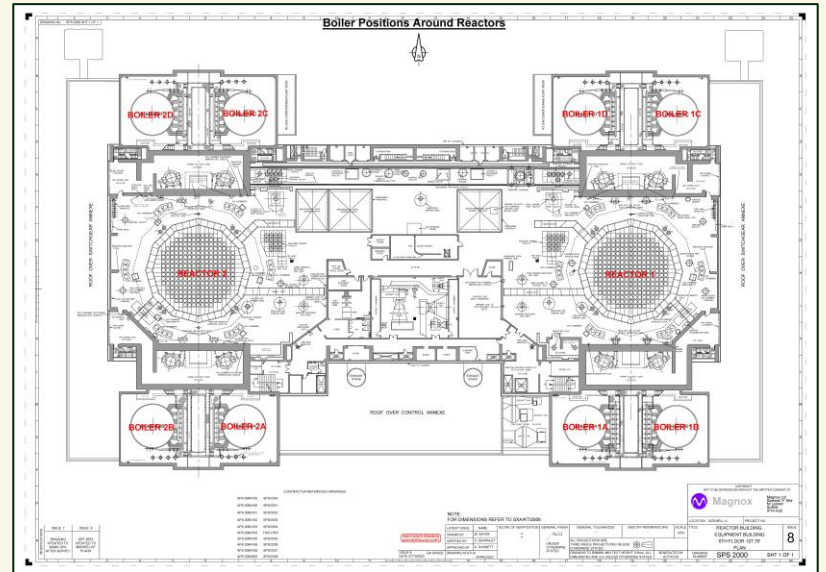
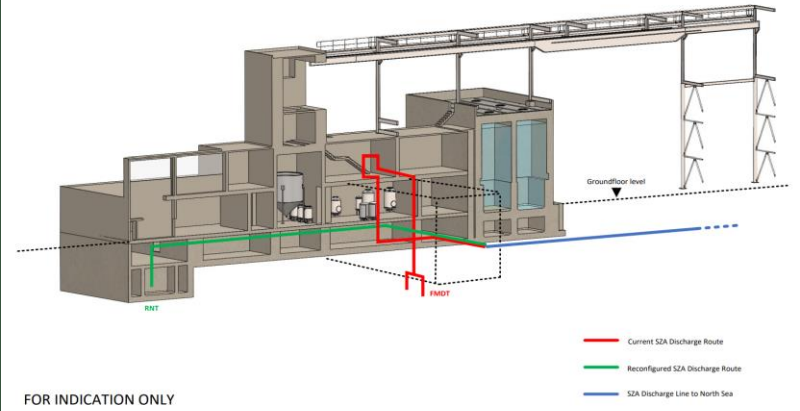

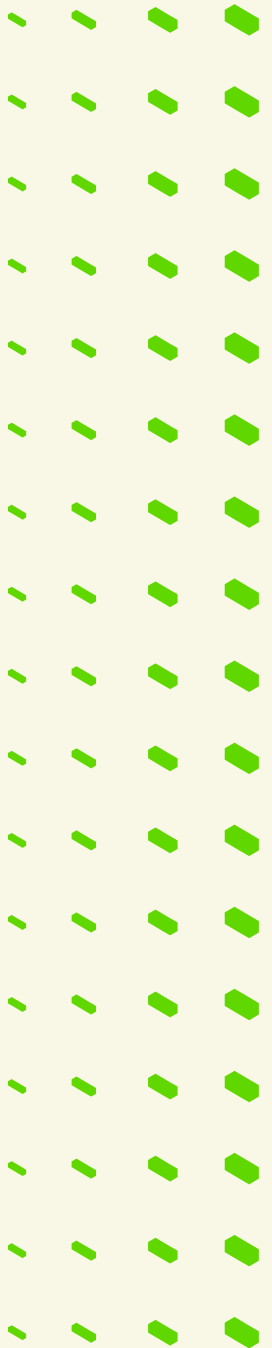


Sizewell A Current and Proposed Effluent Discharge Routes

- 15,629 Tonnes of crushed aggregate transferred to Sizewell C
- 818 lorry loads or 1,636 lorry movements in total.

Skip size reduction and waste processing

Waste processing and size reduction operations have commenced. 57 out of 82 skips have been size reduced and packaged. Waste processing of redundant pond furniture progressing well.



AETP reconfiguration

Installation of non-intrusive pipe runs, strainers and pumps have been completed in the reconfiguration of the Active Effluent Treatment Plant (AETP).

New electrical panels have also been installed as part of the monitoring instrumentation upgrades.

Preparations for commissioning ongoing.

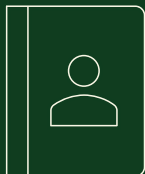

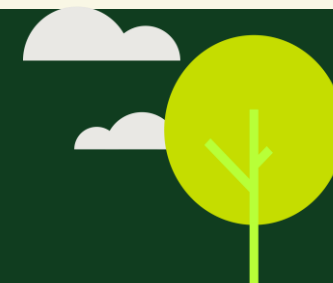
