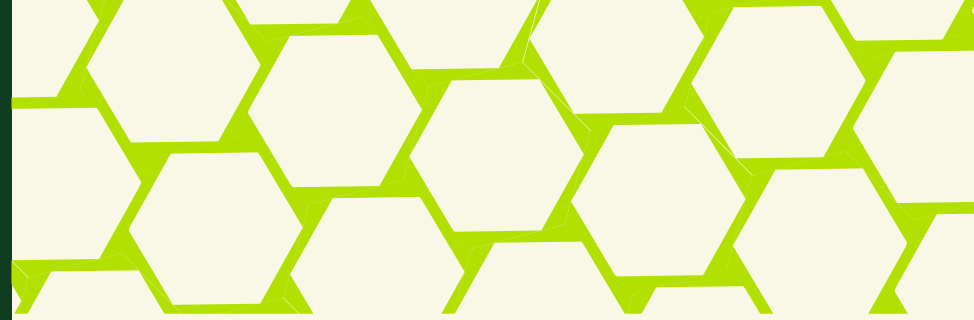

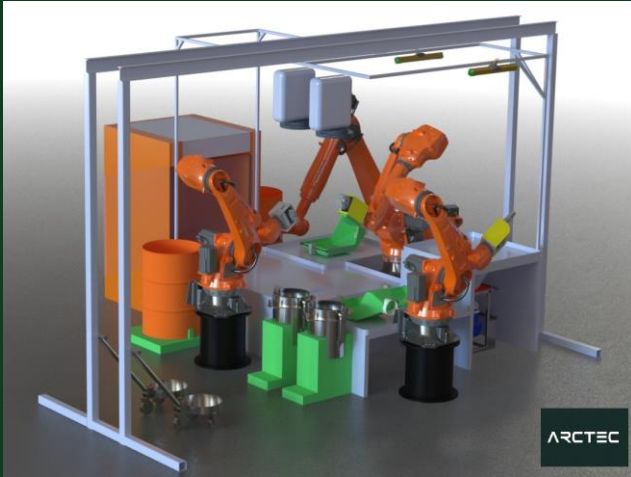


Project updates – Business planning output

Auto-SAS



Safety: Reduces human exposure to hazardous environments

Cost savings: Potential to save **£400M** across the NDA estate

Efficiency: Autonomous systems operate 24/7, saving **38,000** person hours

Sustainability: Diverts **3,000 m³** of waste from GDF, saves **24,000** tons of CO₂ from concrete use



AutoSAS - Preparations

- Historic CO2 tank farm area identified as preferred location for AutoSAS
- Tanks, associated plant and support plinths removed, and concrete slab cleared for future use.



Demolition continues at Oldbury

- Demolition complete of some degrading structures
- Work also complete on the next phase



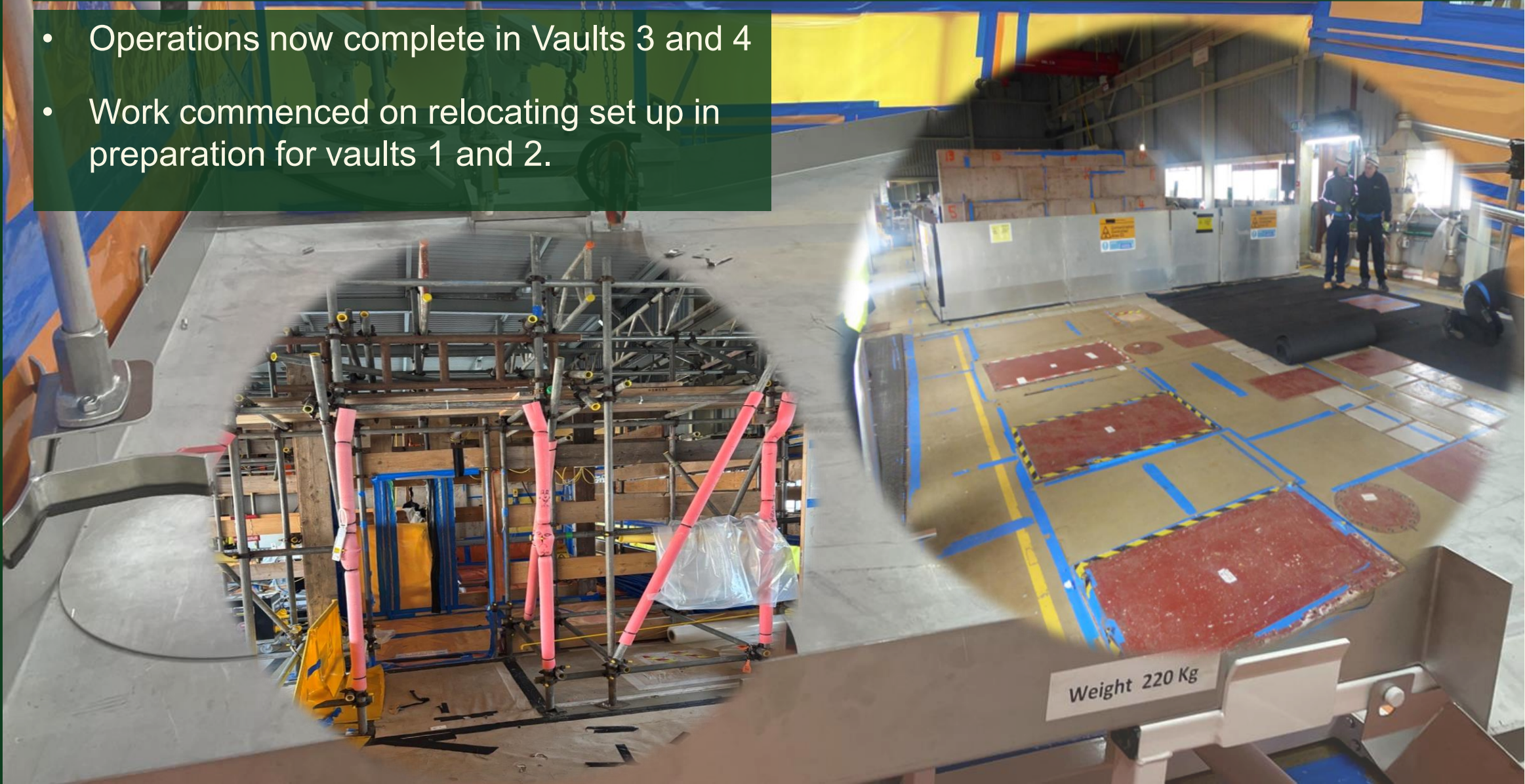
Decommissioning projects

Decommissioning and removal work continues in the Ponds Filtration Plant. Four tanks have been removed; eight tanks remain.



Waste projects – Early Fuel Element Debris (FED)

- Operations now complete in Vaults 3 and 4
- Work commenced on relocating set up in preparation for vaults 1 and 2.

Oldbury wetlands project (Silt Lagoon 3) – Sluice Gate Modifications

- Contractor selected and sluice gate modifications to be completed by the end of financial year

- Thornbury Rugby Football Club - £1,099.78 towards training equipment.

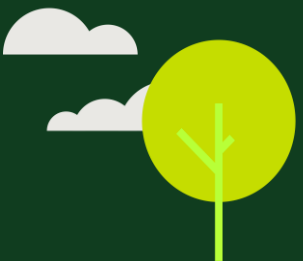
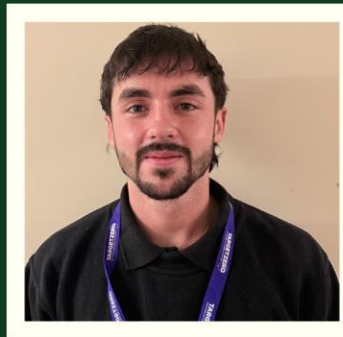
4 Projects above £2,000 have been supported
